

AGREEMENT

For a Judgment Pursuant to Article 78
of the Civil Practice Law and Rules

- against -

EDWARD V. REGAN, as State Comptroller
and Administrator of the New York State
Policemen's and Firemen's Retirement
System, Governor Smith State Office
Building, Albany, New York 12244,

Defendant.

Whereas the parties to this agreement are desirous of discontinuing and terminating the above captioned litigation presently pending concerning the exclusion of "working vacation" compensation in final average salary calculations for retirement purposes, and

Whereas, by decision of Supreme Court, Albany County (Prior, J.) dated August 28, 1992, it was held that the petition of George F. Ofenloch, Gerald M. Rommel, George C. Fahlbusch and Robert C. Bunce be dismissed on the ground that the

petitioners are not entitled to have "working vacation" compensation included in final average salary calculations for retirement allowance purposes, and

Whereas, in an arbitration decision dated March 10, 1993 by Arbitrator Carol Wittenberg, the arbitrator granted the grievance of the Police Benevolent Association against Nassau County, the parties to this agreement agree as follows:

1. The petitioners Ofenloch, Rommel, Fahlbusch and Bunce will withdraw, terminate and discontinue the article 78 proceeding pending against the Comptroller of the State of New York and the New York State and Local Police and Fire Retirement System.

2. The Comptroller and the Retirement System will recalculate the retirement allowance of petitioners Ofenloch, Rommel, Fahlbusch and Bunce, including, for final average salary purposes, the "working vacation" compensation.


3. The Comptroller and the Retirement System will not reduce the retirement allowance of any members of the Police Benevolent Association whose benefit was calculated prior to May of 1988 and which benefit included "working vacation" compensation.


4. For final average salary purposes, "working vacation" payments shall not be included in calculating retirement allowances for any members of the Police Benevolent Association where such payments have not heretofore been included in the calculation, or whose benefit was calculated after April of 1988.

5. The Police Benevolent Association, the Detectives Association, Inc., and the Superior Officers Association agree that any renegotiation of the provision of the agreement between them and Nassau County (§8.11-8) concerning "working vacation"

compensation will not effect the final average salary's of members who retired prior to January 1, 1993.
