



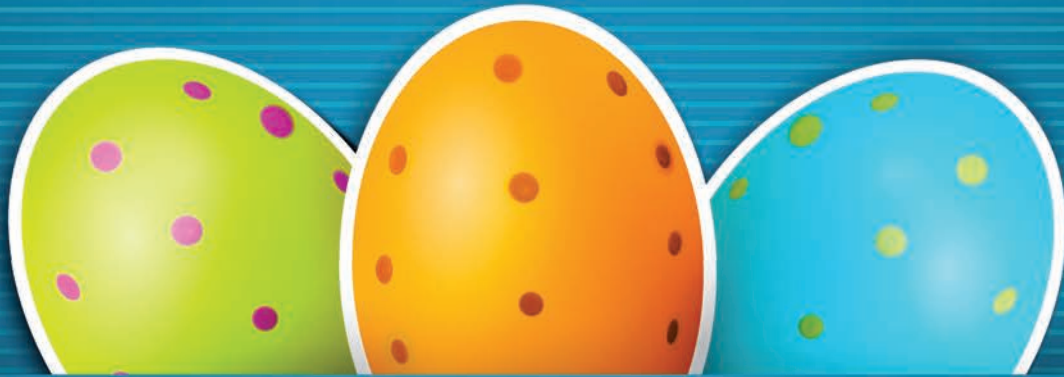

On March 10 the PBA along with the other Nassau County unions held a rally outside the NIFA meeting in Uniondale. It was a symbol of solidarity and a culmination of three years of frustration from frozen wages and steps.

In 2011, County Executive Mangano asked NIFA to freeze wages and steps of all county union employees. This is after he failed to enact the King ED Law attempting to gut union contracts. This is after he repealed the Home Energy Tax creating a \$40 million budget hole. So he goes to NIFA and on the backs of the employees, who are understaffed, underequipped and unappreciated, he asked NIFA to freeze us.

NIFA, who until a recent change in directors has stonewalled any attempt by the unions to negotiate a deal to help the county and lift the wage freeze, was happy to help Mangano screw the employees. But after three years of employee frustration and with the political heat turned up Mangano realized he needed a deal. Then NIFA turned its sights on Mangano and rejected any proposed deal he presented. NIFA, who is funded with county tax dollars, doesn't answer to anyone, projects its own political ideals and hasn't fixed anything, has a strangle hold on the well-being of every county resident and employee.

I'd like to thank everyone who helped prepare and attend the rally at NIFA's meeting and the State of the County address. We must stand together and direct our resources and energies at the people who have intentionally hurt each and every one of us.

First Vice President

The budget process in Albany is due to be completed after this article was submitted. I will send a more detailed Albany report once that is done and update the membership on our ongoing legislative efforts.

The New York State Legislature passed a series of laws relating to the World Trade Center disaster, rescue, and recovery effort. These laws were enacted to protect first responders and their families in the event they became sick or tragically died as a result of their participation. We have several members who participated at the World Trade Center disaster rescue and recovery effort that did not file the required notice of participation with the New York State Police & Fire retirement system to make them eligible for a presumption when they go to apply for a disability retirement if they become permanently disabled as a result of their participation. The deadline to file with the retirement system expired several years ago but we are working on legislation to re-open the filing period. I will immediately advise you if and when this occurs.

Another one of these laws that was enacted in 2006 amended the Workers Compensation law and allowed for a registry of employees who participated in the rescue and recovery effort. This was done to allow an eligible employee to file for workers compensation benefits in the future if they suffer an illness or injury related to their participation and would not be restricted to the statutory time frame for filing a claim. The deadline for filing with the registry also had expired, but this past year, a law was enacted on November 13, 2013, which re-opened the period to file a notice form with the Workers' Compensation Board and extended it to September 11, 2014. This bill is to protect those police officers and other municipal workers who were injured or became sick as the result of participation in the rescue, recovery or cleanup at various sites related to the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. This notice form is not an application for Workers' Compensation benefits. Filing of the notice form permits the individual to later file a Workers' Compensation claim should the individual be diagnosed with a condition or illness attributable to 9/11 exposure. Please keep in mind as long as notice is given to the Workers' Compensation Board by September 11, 2014, an individual must file an actual Workers' Compensation claim within two years of being diagnosed with a condition or illness related to 9/11 exposures. Members who have not yet filed notice with the Workers' Compensation Board, even if not yet diagnosed with any conditions related to 9/11 **must file notice by September 11, 2014** to protect themselves from being barred to file a Workers' Compensation claim in the future.

Legal Report

Accidents on the job can be painful. They can even be catastrophic. But the bureaucratic requirements concerning rights and benefits can be extremely confusing and complicated. When an officer is injured while in the course of his or her duties, there are a number of cases and claims that may arise from a single event. The hope is always that the injury is minor and does not prevent the member from returning to work promptly without serious issues. Unfortunately, some injuries are career ending and lead to disability pensions. As we have discussed in numerous articles, a member in this situation very well may have a disability pension case, a workers' compensation case, a Social Security Disability Insurance case and a personal injury law suit all pending at the same time. The question that we are often been asked in this situation is what offsets, if any, exist among these benefits. For the purpose of this article, we will only discuss the interaction between the oft discussed Accidental Disability Pension and Workers' Compensation.

When a member is injured in the line of duty, they are paid full salary pursuant to Section 207-c of the General Municipal Law. These benefits cease when the member is awarded a disability pension. Therefore, at the point the member comes off the Nassau County Police Department payroll, Section 207-c benefits stop. At this point, the member can pursue monetary benefits through Workers' Compensation. In fact, if a member receives a three-quarter Accidental Disability pension, the New York State Police and Fire Retirement System **requires** the member to pursue Workers' Compensation benefits. The simple reason for this requirement is the most obvious answer of all – the Retirement System takes a dollar for dollar offset against a three-quarter pension for any benefits received from Workers' Compensation. In the case of a Performance of Duty or 50% pension, the Workers' Compensation benefits are in addition to the pension.

However, members should not be concerned about this offset. If a member is awarded a three-quarter Accidental Disability pension and ultimately begins to receive Workers' Compensation benefits, the member loses absolutely nothing monetarily because the combined total of the benefits will always equal three-quarters of the member's final average salary. In addition, both benefits are tax-free benefits. The member is further protected because if the Workers' Compensation benefits are ever reduced or disappear entirely, the Retirement System will increase the pension benefit to make up the difference. Therefore, the Accidental Disability pension benefit is the ultimate protection against the amendments to the Workers' Compensation Law which removed lifetime permanent monetary benefits for partial disabilities. The member will never receive less than three-quarters of his or her final average salary.

Another common situation arises if a member has an injury that results in both a Workers' Compensation claim as

well as a Personal Injury action against a negligent third party. The Workers' Compensation law allows for the County to take a lien against the amount recovered by the injured party. In addition, the County is also permitted to take a "holiday" for payment of benefits for the amount of the net proceeds received by the injured member. Any rule to the contrary would allow for a double recovery to the injured party. Thus, if a retired member is receiving Workers' Compensation benefits and settles a Personal Injury case, the County will cease Workers' Compensation benefits until the net amount of the settlement is exhausted. When the "holiday" ends, the County will begin payments of Workers' Compensation benefits again. For three-quarter pension recipients, the benefit is even greater. As we discussed previously, if Workers' Compensation benefits cease, the Retirement System will reduce its offset so that the member always receives three-quarters tax free. In a situation where Workers' Compensation stops due to a Personal Injury settlement, the Retirement System does not take credit for that settlement and instead makes up for the reduction in compensation benefits. If compensation benefits start again once the net proceeds are exhausted, only then would the Retirement System resume its offset.

The key to this situation is to realize that there is an interaction between the different benefits to which a member may be entitled. These interactions can be complicated and confusing, but we promise to make them as clear to our clients as possible; no two cases are exactly alike. What one agency may be able to claim as an offset simply means that another party is picking up the difference. The offsets exist as relief to one agency by pushing a portion of the payments off on another. Our goal is to make sure the members understand why the offsets exist and from where their benefits will be coming.

With another year comes another issue created by the

Retirement System. Members should be aware that the Retirement System has recently started to request medical records from an applicant's primary care physician as standard protocol on every disability application submitted to the agency. The result of this new policy has created the unintended consequence of adding even more time and delay to the processing of applications. In our discussions with the Retirement System, we were told that the System is hoping this will expedite claims so that they will have as much information as possible to render its decision. However, we have expressed our concern that this is simply an added burden to the decision making process when the applications already list the doctors most associated with the disability being claimed. Quite obviously, this appears to be another attempt by the Retirement System to delay claims or find harmful information in an applicant's medical record on which to base a denial of benefits. Every member should be aware that anytime an application for benefits is submitted, the information that exists in both relevant and irrelevant medical files can become an issue for an application. Our hope is that irrelevant information will have no bearing on the outcome of the claims. However, denying the Retirement System this information could simply lead to the Retirement System stopping the processing of the claim or an outright denial causing the need for a hearing instead. We continue to work with the Retirement System to provide only the information we feel is necessary to come to a fair and just decision on our applications while also protecting the privacy of our clients.

TOP COP (DECEMBER 2013) SGT. SCOTT HARBISON P.O. TRACEY CABEY

On December 30, 2013 at 0859 hours, a male entered the Nassau Educators Federal Credit Union with a handwritten note which stated "There's a man on the roof with a gun and a bomb. Please give me \$75,000.00 in unmarked non-sequential cash, fill the bag and make no trouble and all will be well. Do this correctly and you can ring for help within 5 minutes of my departure". The male walked over to the remote teller station inside the bank, commenced to contact the teller who was situated in the teller room and initiated a robbery of the bank. The defendant proceeded to place the robbery demand note into the air chute which then is transported to the teller. The teller read the note and immediately notified a co-worker that the bank was being robbed. The co-worker then

depressed the silent alarm to summon the police to the bank.

The male picked up the telephone receiver which is attached to the remote teller station, and made a verbal demand for the money, stating "Just give me the money, I owe money to some bad guys, I need money for my family, don't call the police just give me whatever you have".

Sergeant Harbison and Police Officer Cabey responded to the scene and observed the defendant standing at the remote teller station talking on the telephone. Sgt. Harbison ordered the defendant at gunpoint to the ground at which time the defendant ran for the west exit door, dropping his backpack and fled toward New Hyde Park Road. A foot pursuit ensued with the defendant running southbound on New Hyde Park Road. The defendant fled into a rear yard while being pursued by Sgt. Harbison and Officer Cabey. The defendant unsuccessfully attempted to scale a fence in the rear yard and was placed into custody and charged with Robbery.

Members never asked for their wages to be frozen. This is not something that the PBA or any of the members agreed to. We have all been negatively impacted by the ineffectiveness of others. No one can dispute that. Some people at headquarters believe that a deal will cure all. They believe members will suddenly become happy again and a positive morale will miraculously reemerge. I don't think the people at headquarters realize that the damage that has been done. Besides the freeze, a lot of the member's issues are with the way the department handles the personnel and the job as a whole. Some people at headquarters believe officers will instantaneously become more productive because of a settlement. Have the members not been productive the last three years? I believe we have been. Production is more than just numbers on a piece of paper that are analyzed and reviewed at a monthly meeting. We have to ask headquarters: Do you believe you have been productive in your appointed role? The precinct closures have been a failure and have not provided any cost sav-

ings. What about the lack of staffing in specialized units and on patrol? What about the tools that are being provided by our department to officers for use on a day-to-day basis? RMS has been a failure. Our officers work out of dilapidated precincts and booths. The implementation of RMPs to the officers on the street has been slow at best. Several members do not have updated body armor. You wonder why people say: "If they (management) do not care why should I." Members being annoyed or upset about these types of problems prove that they care. Members would like to use the most efficient operating system for arrest processing. They care about driving a well-equipped and serviceable RMP. They want to be provided with the best equipment/facilities possible and be able to experience the best training. By management not providing these tangible items, morale is negatively affected and so is overall production. It has been proven in studies that negative morale leads to dissatisfied employees, sub par performance and absenteeism. Note to all the "penny pinching" appointed officials in our department: low morale becomes very cost prohibitive! Financially compensating one is not the "cure all" for morale and production. Positive morale has to start at the top and work it's way down. The same goes for production. Settling the frozen wages is one small way to help morale. Though it will never fully replace the wrongs that have been done. Besides settling the wage freeze, managing the job effectively and providing the members with an overall positive work environment is imperative in helping morale but more importantly overall production.

TOP COPS JANUARY 2014

On January 21, 2014 Police Officers James Maloney and Daniel Fliedner responded to an unknown problem at the Deep Dale Golf Course in North Hills at approximately 1952 hrs. The Complainant stated that he heard a male screaming for help coming from the woods of the golf course. It was dark with a blizzard in full effect which created white out conditions and 14 inches of snow on the ground. As the Officers arrived at the scene they were unable to gain access to the Country Club due to the heavy snow conditions and they had reached the complainant on foot. The complainant advised that he had heard inconsistent cries for help north of his location. The Officers heard the calls for help off in the distance and notified CB as they headed out on foot in the direction of the voice trekking through 14 inches of snow and deep snow drifts in an attempt to locate this person in distress. The cries stopped briefly but the Officers continued to search the area. The aided was again heard yelling for help and Officers Maloney and Fliedner were finally able to locate him approximately one mile from the main building where the complainant was located. He was in a ravine surrounded by heavy vegetation and it took the Officers several minutes to reach him. His clothes were soaking wet and he was without gloves or a jacket and suffering from hypothermia. He had multiple lacerations to his face and hands from falling through the brush. The Officers were able to get the aided to a clearing and through a gate that backed up to a building which was a nursing home and notified CB to have an ambulance respond. They obtained blankets to warm the aided and waited for the ambulance to arrive. The aided stated that he was new to the area and left work on foot when he became disoriented from the cold and storm and became lost on the golf course for about two hours while trying to get home. The aided was transported to the hospital with com-

plications from hypothermia and frostbite. If not for these Officers determination and disregard for their own personal safety and well-being the aided would more than likely not been found in a timely manner and would have suffered from serious physical injuries if not death.

My brother-in-law has about 2 ft. of global warming on the ground in Rocky Point. South Carolina has had one of the coldest winters since I've been here lows around 19 and day time highs of only 40's. Pictures I've seen of LI remind me of the winter storms of 1978. Gail and I were tired of it and took a Caribbean cruise the first week of January, nothing special, a five day cruise out of FT. Lauderdale to Grand Cayman and Cozemel, due to the weather the Captain made a detour and we ended up in Ocho Rios, Jamaica instead. We hadn't been there so that was fine, hey it was still warm, that's what counted. Princess cruise line always do a bang up job as far as we are concerned. After we returned, old man winter was still rearing his ugly head so on Feb 4 we left for an eco-tour of Costa Rica for 9 days. We used Perillo Tours for this one (Perillo of Italy touring fame). It was a new market for them, this being only the 3rd group they took and it was very well done, not perfect but nothing ever is. We had a small group of 20 people which worked out great, all nice folks from a variety of places. The ladies, of course, all exchanged e-mails and phone numbers even though you know you'll probably never hear from them again. Costa Rica is a central American third world country, they are try-

ing but in my opinion a much too liberal and socialist government is stalling any real achievement. Agriculture (coffee export) and now tourism make up the economy. About 85% of the roads are unpaved and barely two vehicles wide, dogs are the smartest species by far. They never walk in the roadway unlike their human counterparts who sole purpose seems to be keeping the sides of buses and cars clean. They walk on or ride bicycles on the side of the roads and never move so much as an inch for a passing vehicle. In Costa Rica the vehicles horn is used for every driving situation. It reminded me of the "Smith Driving System" the job used to have (we old timers will remember that I'm sure). If Bob Long was still with us he would be proud the way these drivers use their horns. Going around a tight curve, swinging into the on-coming lane, no problem, just toot the horn. Driving in dense fog, just toot the horn every so often. They blow the horn to say hi to their friends and blow the horn instead of raising the middle finger. A universal tool for every driving situation. For the most part I sat in the middle of the bus and looked at the scenery, but never down at the precipice looming below just inches from the wheels. Traffic enforcement was virtually nonexistent except in the larger cities, it could be a highway cops' dream location. We traveled by bus from one side of the country to the other, Caribbean to Pacific, stopping in local establishments for lunch and rustic resorts for the evenings. We hiked in the central rain forest observing the flora and fauna from the ground and then walked over swinging bridges as much as 600 ft. above that same ground, it coincidentally was the only day of the trip it rained. Perfect! We also had a 2 hour river cruise down the San Jose river which I can only say reminded me of the pictures and documentaries I've seen of the Swift boat crews on the Mekong River in Vietnam. Wide open one minute and then the jungle closed over you the next. Monkeys, toucans, sloths, crocs, snakes and caimans were all over in the wild. If you've never heard a howler monkey scream let me tell you it can be scary. For a smallish monkey its howl come from somewhere deep inside. The guide said it sounds similar to a North American Grizzly bear, I can only take his word for that. The last two days were spent in a resort hotel overlooking the Pacific Ocean a mere 97 steps down to the beach. Easy going down, a bit tiring going up, but spectacular views. Overall a great trip but certainly not for everyone. The brochure said at the outset it was not your typical beach vacation and they were right. Friendly people, good food and sites, well worth the time and effort. Costa Rica has become a place for American (Ex-pats) to retire too.
