On March 22, 2021 the Fourth Precinct had their meeting and we had a very respectful productive conversation about many of the issues that we face. As I write this article, we are scheduled to meet with HQ III on March 25, 2021. We hope to meet with all the commands in the very near future and hope to have everyone heading in the same direction for our battle to a better future.

I had sent out a Presidents Message last month which included a warning to be very weary about information that is disseminated anonymously. Unfortunately, there are people out there who still want to divide us and weaken our Union. If someone has an opinion, we encourage you to share it with us and welcome a conversation. As for anonymous information, it is cowardly and filled with nonfactual propaganda that is not helpful to any of our members. I stand behind every decision that I have made and look forward to clarifying any of your concerns that you may have. Until then, be safe.

Legal Report

Recently we were contacted by a City of Newburgh police officer who wanted to appeal a denial of Accidental Disability Retirement (3/4) benefits by the NYS Local Police and Fire Retirement System upon the finding that "the incident alleged to have occurred on 10/16/17 does not constitute an 'accident' as this term is used in Section 363 of the Retirement and Social Security Law."

Readers of the Legal Report will recognize that we have frequently written about the need to have an "accident" as this term is used in the statute and defined in the case law dealing with the subject in order to qualify for ³4. Contact with the City of Newburgh police officer illustrates that this remains a continuing problem.

The Newburgh police officer described his accident as follows: "On the date in question, I was on duty at the City of Newburgh Police Department as a Police Officer along with two partners. While in pursuit of a suspect I fell down an 8+ foot drop onto a black top driveway. I landed on my right foot and left knee struck the ground, I also fell forward scraping both of my hands and right elbow. I followed up to see a doctor 2 days later. I later went back to see a doctor regarding back pain because of this incident."

Was the Retirement System correct in determining that the event as described was not an "accident" within the meaning of Section 363 of the Retirement and Social Security Law? At the outset you should know that there is still a great deal of confusion about what is and what is not an "accident" for Retirement System purposes. Not only have police officers struggled to make sense of this, so have disability lawyers and so have the courts, except for certain very specific events that clearly qualify for ¾ such as MVAs.

The New York State Court of Appeals most recently dealt with this issue in its February 13, 2018 decision, Matter of Kelly v. DiNapoli. This case was the result of two appeals both dealing with the issue of whether the manner of the injuries to a police officer and a firefighter were "accidents" in order to qualify each of the first responders for ³4.

Kelly was a police officer on duty during Hurricane Sandy. Kelly was dispatched, along with another officer to a residence on which a tree had fallen, trapping the residents inside. Kelly saw that the house was "very unstable" as ½ of the roof, a rear wall and a side wall had been knocked down. Kelly called the fire department for help and requested, in addition to ambulances, that the fire department's technical response unit perform the rescue. Kelly decided he had to enter the unstable

structure because of screams coming from the house and his estimation that the fire department was at least two (2) hours out.

When he entered the house, Kelly saw that a resident "had been impaled and put through the floor into the basement." Kelly began to throw debris out of the back of the house to free residents under the rubble when he felt a pain in his shoulder. Shortly after that, there was a rafter that was dangling from a portion of the roof, which began to fall; Kelly reached up to brace the rafter and caused further injury to his shoulder and neck.

The Retirement System initially denied Kelly's application for ¾, so he requested a hearing. The hearing officer rendered a favorable determination, that Kelly's injuries were the result of an "accident," but the Comptroller overturned the Hearing Officer's decision. An article 78 appeal to the Appellate Division followed, which resulted in an affirmation of the Comptroller's decision. The matter ended up on appeal to the NYS Court of Appeals, the highest Court in NYS.

The other cause of action involved a firefighter, Pat Sica, who was injured when he responded to a 911 call that someone was having trouble breathing in a supermarket. At the supermarket, Sica and his crew members found two (2) unconscious persons, one inside and one outside a walk-in freezer. Sica performed CPR for about 30 minutes on the individual inside the freezer and then tended to the one outside the freezer. Sica did not smell any odors or chemicals and he did not see or hear anything indicating that chemicals might be involved in this event. Sica went to the ER when he began to feel nauseous and light-headed, and it was determined that he had been exposed to toxic gases. Initially, Sica's application was denied but was then approved by a Hearing Officer. However, in this case also, the Comptroller overturned the Hearing Officer's favorable decision and Sica filed an article 78 appeal to the Appellate Division, which overturned the Comptroller's determination denying the application for ¾. The Appellate Division's rationale for concluding that Sica was entitled to 34 was that he "was not responding to a fire that presented the inherent and foreseeable risk of inhaling toxic gases or smoke" and that he "was neither aware that the air within the supermarket contained toxic chemical gases, nor did he have any information that could reasonably have led him to anticipate, expect[,] or foresee the precise hazard when responding to the medical emergency at the supermarket." The Comptroller appealed to the Court of Appeals.

The Court of Appeals first dealt with the issue of whether an injury resulted from an "accident" in 1982. The Court now, in its 2018 decision, held that neither Kelly, the police officer nor Sica, the firefighter, was entitled to 3/4. The Court noted that it first defined "accident"

as being "the commonsense definition of a sudden, fortuitous mischance, unexpected, out of the ordinary, and injurious in impact." "Stated otherwise, 'an injury which occurs without an unexpected event as the result of activity undertaken in the performance of ordinary employment duties, considered in view of the particular employment in question, is not an accidental injury."

The Court noted that both Kelly and Sica were "acting within the scope of their 'ordinary employment duties, considered in view of the particular employment in question' and that there was no sudden, unexpected event that was not an inherent risk of [Kelly's and Sica's] regular duties." The argument can be distilled as follows: "... there is substantial evidence in the record to support the determination that Kelly's actions in assisting the injured residents of the house during life-threatening conditions fell within his job duties, and that his injuries did not result from a sudden, unexpected event that was not a risk inherent in his duties as a police officer."

In the case of Sica, the firefighter, he was performing his regular duties when he responded to the 911 call with the rest of his emergency response team. The Court adopted the position of the Comptroller that "exposure to toxic chemicals was a risk for which Sica had been trained, that he had responded to a gas leak in the past, and that his job duties specifically required 'working with exposure to . . . fumes, explosives, toxic materials, chemicals, and corrosives,' the particular risk that caused Sica's injury."

The Court concluded with the observation that neither Kelly nor Sica was entitled to ¾ since the "precipitating causes of [their] injuries were not accidents because they did not consist of sudden, unexpected events that were not risks inherent in" their jobs as a police officer and a firefighter, where the former was required to assist injured people as a first responder and the latter was required to provide emergency services.

Turning back to the Newburgh police officer who was injured when he fell in pursuit of a suspect, is there in any doubt that the Retirement System was correct in finding that the officer's injury was not the result of an "accident"? These decisions illustrate that when police officers and firefighters perform their duties, which include, responding to emergencies as first responders, establishing an "accident" will remain challenging until the law is changed.

BUFFY'S SPOTLIGHT

On March 2nd, Officer Hickman, Simonetti and Dones responded to a suspicious vehicle in the dead of Cooper Court in Uniondale. Officers located a 2017 Black Mercedes Benz parked in front of 508 Cooper Court in Uniondale. Officer Hickman approached the vehicle, the Defendant walked over to the vehicle and Officer Hickman asked the defendant "Do you know who's car this is?", the defendant replied "Yea, it's mine". Officer then looked into the rear of the vehicle and observed a large bag filled with what appeared to be marijuana. Officer Simonetti arrived at scene and began to assist Officer and when he looked in the front driver's side window he saw what he believed to be a black and silver hand handgun lodged between the driver's seat and center console. PO Simonetti asked the defendant if the gun was loaded and the defendant stated that he did not know, Officer Simonetti then asked him if there was one in the chamber and he replied "no, there's not one in the chamber". The defendant was then placed in the rear of RMP 101 and transported to the 1st squad for arrest processing. This is a great job boys!!!! You know I love those hardware collars!!!!

On March 8th, Officer Rooney and Officer McAllister while on routine patrol observed a 2020 Grey Mercedes Benz A220 NY REG (KEH5376) traveling north bound on Nassau Rd at a high rate of speed and failing to signal while changing lanes. Officers activated emergency lights and attempted to pull over above vehicle. The above vehicle while refusing to pull over entered the southern state parkway exit 21 westbound and then exited the southern state parkway at exit 19N on Peninsula Blvd, Hempstead. At the intersection of W Peninsula Blvd/Evans Ave, Hempstead the Defendant exited the vehicle out of the driver's seat while it was moving attempting to flee from officers on foot. Officers

Rooney and Officer McAllister were able to place the defendant into custody after a foot pursuit and brief struggle. Officer Salvadori located to vehicle traveling northbound on Peninsula Avenue and was able to risk life and limb to stop the vehicle while it was ghosting at 3 mile per hour. Officers located a loaded firearm in the vehicle as well as assorted narcotics. Great job fellas!!! More hardware.

FIRST PRECINCT TOP COP AWARD JANUARY 2021

The Top Cop Committee convened and awarded Police Officer Kevin Salvadori, Serial 10173, Shield 2551, Police Officer Emily Slack, Serial 10026, Shield 3549 as the Top Cop of the First Precinct for the month of January 2021. Officers responded to a call of a burglary in progress. Upon arrival Officer Salvadori observed a black Chevrolet Silverado fleeing out of the parking lot by driving over the curb and proceeding north bound on Grand Avenue in Baldwin. The Defendant refused to pull over and drove over the front lawn and struck two vehicles causing extensive damage. The vehicle then entered the Southern State Parkway traveling west bound towards the borough of Queens.

While on the Southern State Parkway, Officer Slack then noticed a dark colored Toyota traveling at a high rate of speed towards Officer Salvadori. The Tovota then recklessly drove in front of Officer Salvadori, and behind the Silverado trying to create a gap with evasive maneuvers to help the Silverado get away. The passenger of the Silverado, exited the vehicle and attempted to resist arrest by pushing and shoving and then attempted to flee from Police Officers Salvadori and Slack. At this time, Officer Salvadori deployed his taser at Defendant with positive results. The Defendant then fell to the ground to which he actively resisted arrest. The Defendant was placed into custody by Officers Salvadori and Slack and it was determined that the vehicle was stolen from New York City. Upon further investigation Officers observed 6 iPads and 3 iPhones in the front passenger floor of the vehicle as well as an atm machine in the pickup part of the truck which was determined to be stolen.

Due to Officers quick response, tactics and observation skills they placed the defendant under arrest. The Defendant was charged with violation of PL 140.20 Burglary 3rd; PL 165.45 Criminal Possession stolen property 4TH; PL 205.30 Resisting Arrest; PL 165.52 Criminal Possession stolen property 2nd; \$50K. The Top Cop Committee is proud to have Police Officers Kevin Salvadori and Emily Slack as the Top Cop of the First Precinct for the month of January 2021

TOP COPS

It has been too long since I put out our Precinct Top Cops. I want to express my appretiaion to our Sixth Precinct Top Cop committee members, Sgt Vitiello, PO Maass, PO Coscino, PO Blozis, PO Sedita, PO Mundy, PO Cioni, PO Karina Baxter. If you have any good arrests or aided cases, get that information to the Top Cop Committee as soon as possible.

JANUARY 2019 P.O. SALVATORE RONGO

On January 10, 2019 PO Salvatore Rongo, while on patrol, observed a motor vehicle commit a traffic infraction. PO Rongo initited a car stop, notified communications, and conducted an investiagtion. The results of the investiagtion revealed that the vehicle had a stolen vehicle alarm from NYPD jurisdiction. There were also numerous illegal narcotics recovered from inside the vehicle. The occupants were charged with 2 Felony and 7 Misdemeanor chrages.

FEBRUARY 2019 P.O.'S JOSEPH ALTIREI, KIRSTIN LORENZO, AND JOSPEH OGINSKI

On February 11, 2019 PO's Altieri, Lorenzo, and Oginski responded to an aided case for a male not breathing. Upon arrival, at scence, the officers observed that coworkers were prefroming CPR prior to arrival. The officers wokred to maintain an open airway and assisted breathing by use of the bag valve mask (BVM). The aided was then appiled with an automated external defibrillator(AED) and received several shocks. The aided became semi-conscious and was breathing prior to transport to the hospital. PO's Altieri, Lorenzo, and Oginski, with great teamwork, relied on thier training, instincts, and Department equipment in the successful recovery of the aided patient.

MARCH 2019 P.O.S BRIAN CORBO, BRIAN SCIBILIA, AND JAMES WALLACE

On March 23, 2019 at 2000 hours PO Corbo, inside a location, was alerted by customers that an unresponsice male was outside the location. PO Corbo's scene assessment revealed that the male was not breathing and did not have a pulse. PO Corbo ran to his RMP to secure Department equipment which included applying the

AED. PO Scibilia and Wallace arrived at scene to assist. The AED was activated and one shock was administered. A short time later the aided regained consciousness. PO Corbo's initial swift actions with PO's Scibilia and Wallace at scene operated with great teamwork, relied on thier training, instincts, and Department equipment in the successful revovery of the patient.

APRIL 2019 P.O. MICHAEL FORMOLO

On April 26, 2019 at 2350 hours PO Formolo responded to an assignment of a suspicious motor vehicle. While canvassing, PO Formolo observed a motor vehicle with a defective tail light and initiated a VTL stop. The investigation revealed that the driver had 20 suspensions on his license and the driver was not authoized to drive the vehicle. A search of the vehicle, after the arrest, resulted in the recoivery of a vial of unknown substance and a scale commonly used in drug transactions. PO Formolo used knowledge of his post to locate a suspicious car and as a result of his investiation removed a danderous driver off the road.

MAY 2019 P.O. EDWARD CODDINGTON

On May 19, 2019 at 1750 hours PO Coddingtion responed to a larceny at the Americana Mall, Manhasset. Communications advised units of a description of the suspects vehicle. PO Coddington's, swift response, resulted in his observation of the suspects vehilce with two occupants. A car stop was initiated and evidence was recoved from the vehicle. A show up was conducted with postivite results. After placing both subjects under arrest the vehicle was searched and a pipe containing cocaine was recovered. Both subjects were transported to the station house where a search recovered conterfiet USC from both arrestees. Further investigation revealed that the arrestees had been involved in three additional grand larcenies within the confines of the Sixth Precinct. PO Coddington's quick response and post knowledge led to the apprehension of two subjects who were involved in numerous crimes within the Sixth Precinct.

On October 27,2020 at approximately 1600hrs Police Officer James Callinan received a phone call at the 7th precinct stationhouse from a concerned male who stated he thought his father was being scammed for money. The caller stated that couriers were on the way to his fathers house to pick up money. Police Officer Callinan

asked to have the father conferenced in on the phone call and explained to him this was in fact a scam and that police were on the way to his residence. Police Officer Callinan was able to coordinate the 7th and the post car to respond to the residence with no visible signs of a police presence as to not deter the courier.

Police Officer Fred Trifaro who was working RMP 705 was informed of the scam and arranged to be dropped off at the residence. Once inside the residence, the victim informed Police Officer Trifaro that he received a phone call from a male that stated his grandson was in jail and that a courier would come to his residence and pick up \$8,500 to bail his grandson out. The victim was worried about his grandson and agreed to the arrangement. When the suspect arrived at the residence he called the victim and asked him to walk outside to the car and deliver the money. Police Officer Trifaro fearing for the victims safety coached the victim as to what to say and have the suspect come to the front door. Once the suspect exchanged a receipt for the money, Police Officer Trifaro exited the residence and had a brief foot pursuit before apprehending the suspect. Detectives from the Seventh Squad were on scene and apprehended the second suspect who was waiting outside the residence in the car.

After a thorough investigation was conducted, it was determined that the suspects had scammed another elderly victim out of \$9,200 in Ossing NY, earlier that same day. Both suspects were placed under arrest and the proceeds from the earlier elder scam were recovered in the suspect's car at the scene.

GOOD-BYE MARIHUANA HELLO CRYSTAL METH


As New York State and Nassau County possibly look to legalize Marihuana come April 1st, a highly addictive drug has surfaced on Long Island. As seen on the series "Breaking Bad" Crystal Meth which is also known as Tina, Ice, or glass is a highly addictive stimulant drug which causes a sense of euphoria when consumed. This drug which is most commonly smoked out of glass pipes can also be snorted, injected, or swallowed. Since the beginning of the year BSO and CIRRT have already recorded approximately 20 arrests related to this highly addictive drug with all of these arrests coming on self initiated stops. Before last year it was unlikely that you would ever see an arrest that involved Crystal Meth but since the pandemic, and the opening up of borders from Mexico it is easier to ship methamphetamine since it is odorless and undetectable.

PAL (POLICE ACTIVITY LEAGUE)

Spring is here and we are happy to have a return to league play for sports. It is great to get back to real games for all the kids in Nassau County while adhering to all the safety protocols. Plainview, Massapequa, Bethpage & Hicksville have been battling it out for the top spot in our PAL 7th-9th grade basketball league. Championship game is April 27th. Our widely acclaimed PAL County Lacrosse program starts this month with our first games since 2019 due to covid. And our successful Nassau County PAL Track program starts this month with track meets at Mitchel Field.

POLAR PLUNGE

On Saturday March 13th members from the Bureau of Special Operations represented the NCPD and participated in the annual Special Olympics Polar Plunge at Tobay Beach. The Bureau along with the PBA was able to raise over \$3,300 in support of the athletes for the special olympics.





For the past two consecutive months, I have discussed the rigors of working out in the winter weather in a maritime capacity. And again, just as I finished writing, another incident takes place that almost makes it seem like I'm reading from a script.

On Thursday, March 4 at approximately 1700 hours, the Crew of Marine 6 did receive an assignment via Marine Base for a Distress Response with Aided aboard a 75' commercial clam dredge located 14 miles southeast of Jones Inlet.

At the time of occurrence, the vessel was actively engaged in commercial clamming with heavy gear in the water. At some point, the vessel's fishing gear became entangled in the propeller rendering it powerless. In that process, a deckhand who was working in the stern of the vessel was struck in the head by the gear and was knocked unconscious suffering a laceration to the head and was in need of immediate medical transport. As the Captain put out a "May Day" call over VHF 16, the vessel began taking on water as 4-6' waves crashed over the transom.

As is often the case during the winter months, the weather was not favorable that day with 30+ knot northwest winds and a small craft advisory in effect for hazardous sea conditions. Immediately upon being advised of the





assignment, Commanding Officer Lt. Adam Fischer established contact with BMC (Chief Boatswain's Mate) David Turner of USCG Station Jones Beach whereby the two put a rescue plan in place.

USCG Station Jones Beach launched a 45' Response Boat Medium to the scene while Marine 6 Crew were ordered to stand by in the vicinity of Jones Inlet to provide support. In the meantime, NCPD Aviation Bureau Pilot Dennis Angermaier, Co-Pilot Dan Galgano and Tactical Flight Officer Greg Millwater responded aboard Helicopter 4. In addition, NYPD Aviation dispatched Helicopter 19 with rescue divers aboard.

Upon arrival at scene, it was determined that the sea conditions were too dangerous to try and effect a surface transfer, so NYPD Aviation deployed two rescue divers from their helicopter. One of the rescue divers was injured while being lowered via cable as he became entangled in the commercial vessel's rigging but still was able to carry out his role in the mission. Once aboard, they secured the aided to a litter to be hoisted and then transferred to the USCG vessel.

Mother Nature had other ideas as the sea conditions and the subject vessel's configuration would not allow for the initial plan to be safely carried out, so the aided was transported directly to Staten Island Trauma Center by NYPD Aviation. NCPD Aviation remained at scene and continued to assist until the assignment was completed.

The two NYPD rescue divers, who were wearing dry suits, were forced to enter the rough and frigid ocean waters and be pulled by a rescue line alongside the USCG vessel to then be recovered. The USCG vessel then promptly returned to base once the divers were safely aboard, with both being transported to local hospitals for injury or exposure.

The clamming vessel remained at scene awaiting a commercial salvage company to provide a tow back to safe harbor.

This was a very serious call and provides yet another example of how dangerous maritime operations can be especially during the cold winter months.

Hats off to both NCPD and USCG management for leading by example and taking the reins to coordinate what became an effective rescue. Special thanks to the NYPD for always providing assistance regardless of the situation. Prayers to the two NYPD rescue divers for a speedy recovery

1941 CONTINUED

On July 21, the Board withdrew the resolution for a pay raise and approved the hiring of an attorney to help obtain the longevity increments that were due them.

A third group within P.O. & P.A., originally called the "Officers Association" was formed on July 28, 1941. It was renamed the Superior Officers Association on February 10, 1964.

These two additional organizations stressed the same beliefs of the P.O. & P.A. and were included in all negotiations and contract talks up until the time of their decertification in the 1980's. The majority of these two groups still remain Associate Members of the PBA.

At the August Board Meeting the topic of discussion was the so called "Cabana Cops" which were a problem in Precinct 4 and "Private Police," in other precincts. One problem with these other "cops" was that they all wore a similar uniform as the members of the County Force and they were often getting involved in disturbances in saloons and still in uniform. This behavior resulted in a number of complaints being made to the Commissioner about "his" Patrolmen.

The Board suggested that some type of distinguishing markings, such as a shoulder patch, be placed on the uniforms of the County Force members so that there would be no further mistakes. Some members opposed this idea. The Commissioner took it into consideration.

On September 15, the attorney that the Board had hired in the attempt to secure the longevity that they were owed gave his report. Mr. Albert Wield of the firm of Littleton and Levy reported that he had found a salary level that was stated in the Nassau County Civil Service Law of 1935 which set the salary of the Nassau County Police at starting pay of \$2,000 and top pay after five years at \$2,700.

A motion to go to court and sue the County for the back pay was defeated. Some men were owed \$1,100 for every year since 1935 which added up to \$7,700., yet the Board voted only to pursue the Longevity of \$200 and \$400 for each rear. They then formed a committee to inquire about the back pay.

The matter of the back pay that was owed each Member appeared to be an open and shut case according to Mr. Wield. With the Law in his hand he assured the Board that they could not lose the case. Rather than going ahead with the Lawsuit, the Board displayed total complacency with regards to the issue. Why?

Most of the members of the Members of the Department had never seen money in the amount that was owed them. \$7,700 was nearly three and one half years pay at the rate that they were currently receiving. All the hardships that they and their families had experienced over the years, all

of the lies that they had been told saying that there was no money budgeted for raises. It was all out in the open now.

On September 29, the Special Open Meeting that the President had called in order to discuss the back pay was held. President Hanlon reported that he had been given an offer by the County Executive of \$120.00 increments for each year owed with a maximum of \$840.00 to be paid. This was some \$6,860.00 less than what they were owed. The meeting exploded with a near riot atmosphere. The President accepted a motion to accept the offer of the County Executive and asked for a vote.

The arguing went on for nearly an hour with tempers flaring and fingers being pointed. Many a friendship was either severely injured or ended on that day. The motion passed sixteen in favor and twelve opposed.

The fall of 1941 was relatively quiet as far as the Association was concerned. Trouble had been brewing for some time with the rest of the world at war. On December 1, the Board voted to give Commissioner Skidmore a Christmas gift in the amount of \$275.00. In turn, he approved an accumulation of sick leave that could be carried over yearly.

By the time the Open Meeting was held the Nation was at war. The Board approved a motion that would prohibit any new mortgages from the Associations Credit Union. The balance in the treasury at the end of the year was \$52,089.52.



Should you be called to Internal Affairs, be it as a witness or subject, you must notify your local PBA representative IMMEDIATELY. If you are deemed a subject, you have the right to have both a union representative and legal counsel with you during the interview. If the investigation is criminal in nature, call me first!

REMEMBER: You must be afforded a reasonable amount of time to contact a PBA representative and attorney. You have the right to confer with us both before and after questioning.

YOUR PBA REPRESENTATIVES AND ATTORNEY ARE HERE TO PROTECT YOU!

In any situation, be it at Internal Affairs or otherwise, where you are asked to write a letter and there is even a remote possibility of discipline, be sure to begin the letter with the following statement:

"I am making this statement for administrative purposes only. I have not done so voluntarily, but in compliance with an order of a Superior Officer. This statement in no way constitutes any waiver of my rights, and this statement, or any part thereof, may not be used against me in any subsequent criminal proceeding."

Finally, upon notifying your PBA representative that you have been called to Internal Affairs as the subject of an investigation, we will arrange to meet prior to your interview at my office to review the facts and circumstances.
