As you know, we voted to ratify the longevity agreement that was recently negotiated between the PBA, the County, and four other unions. I want to thank in a special way the PBA Board, our Trustees and Delegates for their hard work, dedication, and commitment to getting this deal done, and their help spreading the information and facts about the agreement.

It is now my turn to take this deal across the finish line.

We all know the challenges that we have faced trying to get longevity, and other contracts, approved by the membership, the County Legislature, and the Nassau County Interim Finance Authority (NIFA). I am not naive, and know full-well that there is work to be done to show how this deal is fair, reasonable, and fiscally responsible to the County - and I will fight to do so.

In the interest of our organization, I have built and sustained relationships with government and community leaders, and continue to communicate the importance of this agreement to them. I will be continuing to meet and speak with these decision makers through the duration of this process.

These relationships and open dialogue with these leaders plays a vital role in my duties as President of the PBA. I am very hopeful and optimistic for the future, and believe that not only will we continue to reunite our union, but that many of our goals and priorities will be accomplished in the future. For this to happen, I understand that communication is a key to our success, which is why we will be transparent each and every step of the way, keeping the membership informed of progress along the way.

In terms of a timeline of the process of the longevity deal, now that we have voted to ratify the agreement, the Nassau County Legislature will vote on the agreement in their April 25 session. If the vote is favorable, from there it is considered and reviewed by NIFA. We hope that both of these bodies will do their due diligence and come to the same conclusion as we have.

Legal Report

With the changing of the seasons comes that need and desire for the warm summer months, and hopefully some good news for a change. Thankfully, the Retirement System provided that recently on a great win on the issue of accident versus incident, believe it or not! While it did not involve a police officer, it did involve a court officer with an accidental claim which also pays 3/4 of final average salary under the law. Therefore, this win is a major victory for all accidental claims, and it gives some insight into how the current Appellate Division is viewing this issue.

In Matter of Como v. New York State Employees' Retirement System, the Court reversed the Retirement System on an issue that it has been narrowing for years, most notably the issue of slip and falls and what they would claim to be missteps. Our office retained this case several years ago, and it involved a court officer who was injured while working in her courthouse after the close of general business in the building. She typically did not work much overtime, but on the date in question, she was walking from one area of the building to another in order to return her radio to the technology room in the basement. As she walked through the main vestibule of the courthouse, she unexpectedly slipped and had her legs fly out from underneath her. She landed hard on the white marble floor suffering devastating injuries to her neck and back.

As we have discussed numerous times in Legal Reports, the initial accident reports were very important in this case. Fortunately, this court officer did just enough in her reports to protect herself, but she did not consult with anyone prior to drafting them so several crucial facts were omitted. She simply wrote that as she walked from one area of the building to another, she stated that she slipped on the floor which apparently had been freshly mopped. Her supervisor then investigated and wrote that the applicant had slipped on a wet floor. This lack of specificity led the Retirement System to jump all over the claim, and It found that the applicant was not injured as a result of an "accident" as the term is used for 3/4 claims. We obviously appealed.

During testimony, the applicant noted that the white marble floor made it impossible to see whether the floor was wet until after she had already slammed to the floor. She found out after the fall that the floor had been freshly mopped by the maintenance staff, but they did not put out a "Wet Floor" sign. Further, she stated that she knew the floor was wet because her pant leg and side of her body was wet after falling to the floor. She also mentioned that because she rarely worked overtime, she was entirely unaware of when and where the maintenance staff would clean the floors.

Remarkably, despite this very straightforward testimony outlining the unexpected nature of her fall, the Hearing Officer affirmed the Retirement System and found that an "accident" had not occurred.

The Hearing Officer's decision indicated that the floor should have been observably wet because the applicant testified that her clothes were wet after the fall. In addition, the Hearing Officer also adopted the Retirement System's absurd argument that the slipping on wet floors must be an inherent risk of the job of a court officer because they were issued non-slip rubber soled shoes as part of their uniforms. Also, the Hearing Officer indicated the injury occurred due simply to the inattention of the court officer as opposed to any unexpected, out of the ordinary act.

As one can imagine, we were upset by the decision, but we were far from shocked. The Retirement System has narrowed this definition for years, and it has made a particular focus on trying to wedge most cases with these type of facts into missteps or simple slip and falls as opposed to anything out of the ordinary. The case law in this area also has been horrible for years with many of the applicants being accused or blamed for essentially being clumsy. However, the cases that came down in the past three to four years did offer a glimmer of hope even in the face of the overwhelming defeats by applicants. In the Matter of Kelly that has been discussed in past articles as well as Matter of Stancarone, the Appellate Division appeared to create a logical distinction between the missteps that could be anticipated as opposed to those that could not. The same logic could and should be applied to hazards in the workplace. That give us the argument and line of thinking that we thought could swing this claim.

On appeal to the Third Department, we focused on the fact that all of the uncontroverted evidence in the matter supported the contention that this court officer was injured as a result of an injurious event and hazard that she could not anticipate. Even if she was wearing non-slip shoes as part of her uniform, there was nothing in the record to indicate she would have anticipated a wet floor at that time. The white marble obscured the wetness of the floor, the lack of a "Wet Floor" sign provided no indication of the freshly mopped floor or the hazardous condition, and the fact she rarely worked overtime provided her with no constructive knowledge that the floors would be mopped after the courthouse closed to the general public. This was simply a situation that she could not see coming.

In a decision that chalks one up for the good guys for a change, the Appellate Division flat out rejected the arguments of the Retirement System and the Attorney General's office instead laying out that the facts at hand clearly showed a situation that could not be anticipated by the applicant. Thus, the Court ruled this is exactly the type of "accident" envisioned by the State Legislature when this statute was enacted. Therefore, as we have been arguing for years, the question of accident turns essentially on whether the event causing the injury could have been reasonably anticipated or controlled by the applicant.

What did we learn? As we have been advocating for years, those initial accident reports can be crucial to a case. Bad facts or bad statements that lead to a finding that the applicant could have seen the event coming from a mile away will instantly kill a 3/4 case. Also, those factors showing that the event in question could not be anticipated will be the biggest things to make sure we fit into our accident statements because this is clearly the path that the Court wants these 3/4 cases to be paid upon.

As always, it is an honor and a privilege to be the Disability Counsel to the PBA for all these years. Our experience with these cases gives us the unique opportunity and perspective to argue these cases and evaluate them with the institutional knowledge of both wisdom, creativity, and the knowledge of the current case law. 

On February 17th Officers Foley and Walsh observed a vehicle with a defective head light and pulled behind the vehicle. While behind the vehicle, it escalated its speed and made several quick turns in an attempt to lose the RMP. Officers at this point activated their emergency lights to conduct a VTL stop. The vehicle refused to pull over and fled down the dead end of Valdur Court. The driver then fled on foot with Officers Walsh and Foley right behind. As the suspect ran to a real yard he attempted to scale a fence but was unsuccessful and then turned on PO Walsh with a loaded firearm in his hand and pointed it directly at PO Walsh's chest. PO Walsh observing the firearm and a green dot on his chest, feared

for his life and took cover. PO Foley, still in foot pursuit observed the Firearm, and the defendant pointing it at his partner. The suspect then threw the firearm over the fence as officers were attempting to place him into custody. After a violent struggle the suspect was taken into custody. Officers recovered a loaded .45 caliber handgun with a laser sight. This is another amazing Buffy spotlight. Great job fellas and luckily no one was injured. OUTSTANDING WORK!!!!!!!!

On March 1st, BSO Offices Sierzant and Psomas while in Roosevelt observed a vehicle that matched a description of a prior armed robbery. Officers attempted a VTL stop, and the vehicle refused to pull over. After the vehicle was involved in an auto accident, and seemed to be disabled, Officers exited their RMP and were immediately fired upon by the suspect. One of the rounds striking the hood of the RMP. The suspect then fled again southbound on Nassau Road and eventually fled the vehicle on foot, with the gun still in his hand and pointing at officers. The suspect was taking into custody without further incident. Every officer involved, BSO, First Precinct officers, Supervisors and Detectives all did an amazing job. I am sure for most of the cops that were working that night, this was the first time hearing a fellow officer coming over the air with those dreaded words "shots fired." The suspect was wanted for numerous shootings in Hempstead and is known violent gang member. Again OUTSTANDING!!!!!!

MARINE 7: ARTHUR LOPEZ

2022 marks the 10-year anniversary of the passing of PO Arthur Lopez. When Marine 7 was purchased it was dedicated to his loving memory. Marine 7 had been out of service with mechanical problems for an extended period of time but has recently made her triumphant return to the fleet in her new home at Roosevelt Park Marina in Oyster Bay.



It was a proud moment to see her back in the water adorning the name of our fallen brother. Every time I step on board, I make a point of saying a prayer and thinking about the sacrifice made by PO Lopez. God Bless him and his family. He will never be forgotten and lives on in our hearts and minds.

JONES INLET DEATH TRAP



As the majority of South Shore boaters are aware, Jones Inlet has become a veritable "death trap" in recent years. This can be attributed to the constant shift of sand as a result of longshore drift as well as errors in previous jetty reconstruction projects.

The Inlet has shoaled up to the point where it is almost impossible to pass through at the bottom of the tide. The "marked channel" is supposed to be designated for safe passage but anyone doing so would be taking a significant risk. Buoys 3 and 4 are now missing and it's anyone's guess when this will get rectified.

On a rough day, the entire Inlet is closed out all the way across and is seemingly a wall of whitewater. Jones Inlet is in need of immediate dredging to eliminate the existing shoals. With a project this size, however, comes the political red tape.

A number of local recreational boaters joined forces with some area commercial captains and formed a grass roots social media campaign to petition Albany and bring awareness to the politicians who dole out the funds. The Army Corps of Engineers has surveyed the Inlet and the dredging project is moving forward but at a snail's pace. Senator Chuck Schumer has been working with them and has allocated the funds necessary to complete the project which is slated to begin in October 2022.

We have had countless groundings as well as several capsized vessels in Jones Inlet in the last several years with 2 fatalities. Unfortunately, the South Shore can't afford to wait until October with the boating season quickly approaching. As per Albany, there is a mandatory 120-day "Contract Advertising Clause" where the project goes out to bidding. Thus, any expedition of this project is unlikely to happen.

How does that affect us as Marine Bureau officers? Well, as if we didn't have enough to worry about as Police Officers, it puts our lives and the livelihoods of our families in even greater danger every time we step foot on deck.

I speak from experience when I explain to people the feeling of being out at sea and not knowing if I'd make it home. Being 80 miles offshore in 20' seas makes you appreciate what you have in life when you think there's a chance you might not have it anymore. It creates a feeling that's difficult to put into words and that sobering feeling is going to be more frequent as the boating season gets into full swing. Every time a Marine Bureau crew enters or exits Jones Inlet, the pressures mount in an already dangerous existence.

WATER SAFETY & SURVIVAL TRAINING

On February 8, 2022, the Marine Bureau Training Staff and Dive Team members joined forces with BSO members for a night of Water Safety and Survival Training at SUNY Old Westbury. PO's Joseph Stassi, Michael Beard, Al Perez and Sgt. Joseph Frederico and were all on hand to help educate these officers. During the training, BSO officers learned swim strokes, life saving maneuvers and survival techniques. It was a successful collaboration and it was good to get the chance to work alongside of our brothers in other areas of the department. Stay safe gentlemen and we look forward to getting the chance to train together again soon.

SMPVOC

The 31st installment of SMPVOC or Standard Marine Patrol Vessel Operations Course begins on April 4, 2022. As of now, we have 15 students from a number of different agencies scheduled to start training to become professional mariners. It's always a pleasure to be a part of such a great program that was developed by NCPD Marine Bureau retired PO Joel Fuoco. With each passing year, this program grows bigger and better.



OPERATION GATEWAY 2022

NYS Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services has approved our request to conduct our annual Operation Gateway. This initiative sees the Marine Bureau join forces with US Customs and Border Protection officers to target Foreign vessels who are transiting Nassau County District waterways. We are currently awaiting HQ stamp of approval before we gear up for Foreign Flag vessel interdictions for possible smugglers of contraband, illegal weapons, illicit drugs and human trafficking.

ANCIENT MARINERS

The Ancient Mariners recently made a \$500 donation to the Nassau County PBA Widows and Orphans Fund. The Ancient Mariners are a group of retired Marine Bureau members who have remained close friends after separating from the job. They do a great deal of charity work and are instrumental in maintaining the pride and tradition that make the Marine Bureau such a special family to be a part of. Thanks gents!

A little business: a new event type TRANSLATOR has been added to the CAD system. When a member receives an assignment to translate, request that you have this call type instead of the event. This can also be self-initiated through the MDT. This is something that we had been requesting to have through the Department and are glad to see that our skills as translators has been recognized as important as other activity done during our tour. Don't forget to remind people to utilize Language Line and how easy it is to utilize!

And on that note - NCPD Department Administration Order 08-001 states: When a member of the Department writes a Supporting Deposition or Statement of Admission in English and reads it to the complainant/witness/subject in a foreign language the following should be used: "Det/P.O. (name) has read this to me in (language). I understand what s/he has told me, it is the truth and sign my name to it." Followed by: "I, Det./P.O. (name), am fluent in both (language) and English. I read the above statement to (complainant/witness/subject) in (language). I asked if s/he understood and

asked him/her to affix their signature to it." (used most often when the deponent speaks but does not read or write their language)

Also, when a Supporting Deposition or Statement of Admission is written in a foreign language by a complainant/witness/subject and is re-written in English by a member of the department, it should include: "I, Det./P.O. (name), am fluent in both (language) and English. I have read the attached statement in (language) and re-written it in English. It is a translation to the best of my ability." This is used most often when deponent speaks, reads and writes their language. Statement in their language signed by deponent and the officer talking the statement.

If the Det./P.O. has the skills and ability to write in the language of the deponent and chooses to write the Supporting Deposition or Statement of Admission for the deponent, you may do so. While often we hear that the Spanish speaking officers are frustrated, overutilized, and pulled in every direction, remember that it is for the communities we serve. More precisely, our people in the communities we serve. We would want it done for our family members if they needed it done for them.

Please keep in mind however, if you are translating for another post, command or department, the primary officer should be the one to do the English part of the 32B and the translating officer only add/sign the caveat.

Dear PBA Member,

Periodically, your PBA reminds its membership of appropriate steps that should be taken if you are called to Internal Affairs or become part of ANY department investigation. Recent events underscore the importance of involving the PBA and your legal counsel, me, as soon as possible.

Should you be called to Internal Affairs, be it as a witness or subject, you must notify your local PBA representative IMMEDIATELY. If you are deemed a subject, you have the right to have both a union representative and legal counsel with you during the interview. If the investigation is criminal in nature, call me first!

REMEMBER: You must be afforded a reasonable amount of time to contact a PBA representative and attorney. You have the right to confer with us both before and after questioning.

YOUR PBA REPRESENTATIVES AND ATTORNEY ARE HERE TO PROTECT YOU!

In any situation, be it at Internal Affairs or otherwise, where you are asked to write a letter and there is even a remote possibility of discipline, be sure to begin the letter with the following statement:

"I am making this statement for administrative purposes only. I have not done so voluntarily, but in compliance with an order of a Superior Officer. This statement in no way constitutes any waiver of my rights, and this statement, or any part thereof, may not be used against me in any subsequent criminal proceeding."

Finally, upon notifying your PBA representative that you have been called to Internal Affairs as the subject of an investigation, we will arrange to meet prior to your interview at my office to review the facts and circumstances.
