The upcoming election cycle for 2023 concentrates on your local elected officials. The Nassau County Police Benevolent Association Political Action Committee(PAC) completed the interviews of our local Legislators and Town Supervisors. I am very honored, as First Vice President, to be Chairperson of the Legislative Committee. I would like to thank Corresponding Secretary John Paterson and the Political Action Committee for their professionalism when screening the candidates. The Nassau County Police Benevolent Association is not an arm for one political party. We proudly endorse candidates on both sides of the aisle. It was these same Legislators that unanimously approved our contract this year.

In any election whether local, state, or national every vote counts. This was proven, last year, when a local New York State Assembly seat resulted in 50.1% to 49.9% votes counted. That is exactly the slimmest of margins. Very shortly will will have our list of endorsements for membership. We also partner with the Suffolk County Police Benevolent Association for their list of endorsed candidates. # 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President's Message

### **MATRON DUTY**

In July of last year, the Department issued Administrative Order 22-008 titled DETENTION CELLS – Female Arrestees. We were told that it was issued in order to comply with NYS Law Title 9 NYCRR §7504.1(e). That statute requires the presence of a matron when female prisoners are detained in a detention area. Since Precinct arrest rooms and Squad lockups or "fishbowls" have cells, they are considered detention areas and require a matron of some sort.

Although both the Department order and NYS law clearly states that a matron is necessary only when in a cell, it still created a lot of confusion. Supervisors began to order female Patrol Officers to discontinue patrol, come off post and act as matrons whenever there was a female arrestee. This is not always necessary and the need for a matron depends upon where the arrest is being processed. A simple way of putting it is: You need a matron in a detention area. A detention area has cells. If the area has no cells then it is not a detention area, and there is no need for a matron.

Meanwhile, compliance with our contract depends on who is making the arrest. On August 15, 2023, there was a revision to OPS 2115 Arrest Processing, including Squad Arrests. The new procedure deviates from the statute and previous order and ignores the most important component which is the cell. Now, as per the order, female patrol officers may be ordered off patrol to act as matrons on female squad arrests. This is not a function of patrol, or a call to service. This is matron duty, and it violates minimum manning.

Can the Department process female squad arrests without violating minimum manning and comply with State Statute? Yes! In fact, the Department has already supplied the solution within the new order. If there is a female squad arrest where the arrestee needs to be in a cell, but no female detectives are available to assist, the arrestee should be transported to Headquarters for processing at CTS since there is a matron on duty 24/7.

The PBA has filed a grievance regarding this issue and it was recently assigned an arbitrator. I'm still hopeful that we can resolve this matter with the Department.

In the meantime, we are proceeding with arbitration and we will keep your PBA Reps updated about this ongoing

issue. If you have any questions, let them know.

Remember to always back each other up and be safe.




### Fifth Precinct by Sal Milone



### MARINE BUREAU

### WELCOME ABOARD

Congratulations to the 2023 Marine Bureau Temp Class: PO's Aquino, Barrucheri, Cardino, Cascio, Verde, Vlasaty and Witt. Welcome to the unit, gentlemen! Be sure to look out for each other and learn as much as you can. Don't be afraid to get your hands dirty, jump in and get the work done but most of all, don't hesitate to ask questions. The veteran members will be more than happy to share their experience and help you assimilate to your new surroundings. This unit is a great place to work and I think you all will do just fine.

### **SMPVOC**

On April 3th, the 32nd installment of SMPVOC commenced out at the SCPD Marine Base. The aforementioned officers along with members of the SCPD Marine Bureau, NYPD Harbor Unit, NYS ENCON Police, NYS Police, Suffolk County Deputy Sheriffs, East Hampton Town Marine Patrol, Babylon Bay Constables and Groton Police Department embarked on our annual campaign to learn how to become Marine Law Enforcement officers. As always, the class was filled with exciting moments and achieved the desired results of properly preparing the students as they embark on a new chapter in their law enforcement careers. The team of instructors we have on staff at this time are amongst the most qualified maritime professionals in marine law enforcement which always yields positive results.



### MAY DAY

On Friday, March 31, 2023 at approximately 1500 hours, PO's Beard, Votinelli and Siesto were working a day tour aboard Marine 2. While on patrol in the Western Bays, the crew overheard a May Day call on VHF Channel 16 for a vessel adrift in the vicinity of Wreck Lead Railroad Trestle in Island Park. The vessel had suffered a mechanical failure and the anchor was not holding. The wind and current were pushing the boat towards the rocks.

The crew arrived on scene in a matter of minutes and observed the subject vessel dangerously close to the rocks at the embankment of the Wreck Lead facility. Patrol vessel operator PO Votinelli approached the boat and the crew passed off a line which was then fastened to her midship cleat.

Marine 2 then pulled the vessel away from the rocks and the operator was instructed to pull the anchor, then fasten the line to the bow cleat and pass the line off to the crew. PO Votinelli then turned the patrol vessel and placed the boat in side tow and took it back to the Long Beach Municipal boat ramp.

This assignment is a great display of marlinspike seamanship and quick thinking on the part of the boat crew. Highly effective line handling in a stressful situation yielded a positive result that could have easily seen a catastrophic ending. Nice job, boys!



### **RUNAWAY VESSEL**

On Wednesday April 26, 2023 at approximately 1900 hours, PO's Clauss, Ficalora and Litvinski were working a night tour aboard Marine 2. At the aforementioned time, they received a Distress Response assignment for a man overboard in Parsonage Cove in Baldwin. The male had fallen off of his skiff while trying to retrieve his hat which blew off. The emergency cutoff lanyard failed to activate and did not kill the engine as intended. The skiff was traveling at approximately 12 knots and was spinning in circles at the location.

The crew arrived on scene and approached the vessel. They tried throwing a line in the water in an attempt to foul the propellor but this technique did not work. PO Clauss then maneuvered the patrol vessel alongside the skiff at cruising speed and PO Ficalora was able to jump onto the skiff, disengage the engine and take control of the runaway boat. The crew then tended to the victim and proceeded to tow the vessel to safe harbor. This assignment is a fantastic display of tactical boat maneuvering and effective teamwork. This type of assignment can present a very dangerous situation and the crew handled it with ease.



### WATER EMERGENCY AT CENTRE ISLAND

On Monday, May 15, 2023 at approximately 2330 hours, a call was received for a person in the water in the vicinity of Oyster Bay Harbor, Lloyd Harbor. According to reports, two young men were underway aboard a 25' sailboat when one fell overboard. The remaining man was inexperienced and was unable to assist and eventually 911 was called.

Upon arrival, Marine Bureau members were assisted by Town of Oyster Bay Constables and USCG personnel in gathering information, conducting the investigation and commencing search operations. A multiple agency search for the missing male was then conducted by The Marine Bureau, Emergency Services Unit, Aviation Bureau, NYPD Aviation Bureau, US Coast Guard, Oyster Bay Constable, Bayville Fire Department and the Oyster Bay Fire Department.

Having searched through the night with negative results, NCPD Dive Team members, PO's Carlson, Leek, Locher, Kogan and Zylinski, under the supervision of Lt. Fischer, were called in to conduct advanced searches with the Side Scan Sonar. With assistance from the Christian Aid Ministries Search and Rescue Team, NCPD Dive Team squads covered an extensive search area over a period of several days.



In particular, PO Kogan acted as the point person to coordinate search parties and spent countless hours analyzing Side Scan Sonar data and coverage areas to determine further efforts. Although the end result was not what was intended, the family of the missing man was brought closure when his body was recovered by a fisherman in the waters off Caumsett State Historic Park Preserve in Lloyd Harbor. This case is still under investigation.

### **DOG DAYS OF SUMMER**

On Saturday, June 3, 2023 at approximately 2220 hours, a call was received for a vessel aground in Sea Dog Creek in the vicinity of Reynolds Channel, Point Lookout. As a result of the full moon high tide, the adjacent marsh had become obstructed and the vessel ran aground. The operator did not have a commercial assistance contract and was alone aboard the boat with only his dog. With high winds blowing, the pair became cold and worried. POs McGovern, Siesto and Votinelli arrived on scene aboard M5, observed the vessel and made contact with the operator. At this time, the dog proceeded to jump overboard and was quickly rescued by the crew. The boat was then removed from the marsh and towed to nearby West Marina for a vessel inspection. What was a routine grounding assignment took a turn for the worse when the dog entered the water and a rescue was necessitated. This is a good example of being ready for the unexpected at any time.



### SECURITY CALL

On Saturday, June 24, 2023, US Speaker of the House Kevin McCarthy (R) was invited to a private fundraiser at a local waterfront residence in South Bellmore. Marine Bureau units were requested to provide maritime security in the area for the duration of his visit. Upon arrival, Marine 1 and Marine 5 conducted extensive sweeps for potential terrorist activity, canvassed the area for maritime threats and maintained a security zone in the adjacent waterway. County Executive Blakeman was also on hand to welcome Speaker McCarthy and the event went on as scheduled without incident.



### HISTORY

The replica sailing vessel H.M.S. Bounty that appeared in the 1962 version of Mutiny On The Bounty (starring Marlon Brando) was constructed by Smith and Rhuland, Ltd. of Lunenberg, Nova Scotia. The ship was launched in 1960. The subsequent home port for the H.M.S. Bounty was Greenport in Suffolk County. When the Bounty required marine inspection and repairs in the years following the production of the movie, it moved to Jakobson Shipyard in Oyster Bay. The Bounty could be regularly seen moored at Jakobson's main pier during the 1960's. During this time, the Marine Bureau would often receive calls complaining of folks swimming out from Beekman Beach and attempting to access and board the Bounty for surreptitious purposes.

# **Retiree Column**

Ladies and Gentlemen, welcome back from your summer vacation. To the rest of you that are retired / retired, enjoy the rest of your vacation. These in most cases are spent working on "Honey Do" projects.

So many of our number retired at their earliest convenience and went in to many different fields of endeavor, new careers even jobs within our beloved PDCN. To name just a few of our retired Members, who chose to put their energies into our State of the Art Police Academy, the David S. Mack - Law Enforcement Training Pavilion are; John Nikiel, Bob DelSignore, Al Miller, Doug Stiegelmaier, Mike O'Leary and Kevin Kane.

On June 11, I had the pleasure of attending the 2nd Annual Retired Members Day at the Academy Hosted by, your friend and mine, COP Patrick Ryder and sponsored by the Nassau Police Foundation. The Commissioner gave a talk where he laid out the various training scenarios that our young brothers and sisters are going through in an effort to make sure that they go home in one piece at the end of the tour.

Years ago an "old timer" told me; "Kid, police work can be 95% BS most of the time. But that 5% can eat you up and spit you out dead if you don't pay attention to everything going on around you."

On display in the lobby is Bell Helicopter, now here is where it gets interesting. Retired Det. Mike O'Leary conducted a sixteen month search which eventually led him to Minnesota where he found this, the Departments first Helicopter. The NCPD Foundation provided for the transporting of the ship back to Nassau where Assistant Commissioner Tom Daly took charge and refurbished it getting it to its current location the day before Retired Members Day.

When they painted it they put tail number 602 on it, which was the helicopter that Sergeant Robert Harris was flying on May 17, 1978 when he developed engine trouble and instead of landing in the ball fields in the rear of MacArthur High School, which were in use, he managed to keep it airborne until he crashed in a nearby clearing along side of the Southern State Parkway, sacrificing his life in an effort to avoid injuring any school children.

Foot notes to the story, if you need to find something or someone, call Mike.

On the morning of October 7, 1975, a good number of the NCPD were scouring the neighborhood of West Hempstead looking for a slug, who it turned out was from Bayside that had shot PTL. Matt Giglio of EAB, who was assisting the 5th Precinct with a business burglary on Hempstead Avenue. Hour after hour the night dragged on with no success and dawn was beginning to break when lo and behold Mike comes walking out of a yard with the POS in cuffs.

How do I know he was a slug and a POS? I went to high school with him.

Matt suffered terribly from the gunshot and subsequently died on December 16, 1975. His murderer was sentenced to life but eventually became eligible for parole which he applied for as soon as possible. For several years he made his plea for clemency which was rejected by the parole board due to a strong presence and letter writing campaign spearheaded by your PBA, which brought Matt's widow and family to painfully testify at each of the annual hearings. Following a denial at his last hearing he hung himself upon return to his prison cell.
