There is no greater time than now to be united as a membership. I hate to recite a cliché, but united we stand and divided we fall. We all have the same goals of enhancing our futures, so I remain confident that we will persevere.

We have a scheduled meeting with the negotiators for the County on February 19, 2021 and will continue from there. As always, we will make every effort to maximize our chances for the most favorable scenario possible.

Legal Report

All members should already be aware of the Medical Review procedure that exists to challenge a decision of the Department's Police Surgeons on several issues. However, it is always important, especially at the beginning of a new year to remind you of the process. For starters, this is a right of each member of the PBA, and it warrants a reminder that simply because the Police Surgeon "orders" a member on a medical issue, that does not mean that the order cannot be challenged. Although meeting with the Police Surgeon due to an injury or illness can be an intimidating situation and a member might feel like he or she has no choice, that is obviously not the case. So, as we say on a regular basis

in The Legal Report, make sure that you keep your PBA delegates and/or trustees in the loop when you are sick or hurt. They will be able to advise you appropriately regarding your rights including your rights to Medical Review.

The Memorandum of Understanding, agreed to by the PBA and the Police Department and ratified on March 25, 1993, created a Medical Review procedure to be used in several instances. These instances include (a) whether a police officer can work in either a full or restricted duty capacity; (b) an officer's ability to work within his or her physical limitations while at work; (c) whether a specific condition constitutes recurrence of a previously sustained line of duty injury; (d) whether an illness or injury was sustained in the line of duty; and (e) the length of time it may be necessary for a member's disability to resolve.

The starting point for any of these situations is that there be disagreement between the police officer and the Police Surgeon. Quite often we will receive a call from a member that he/she went to the Surgeon, and the Surgeon told them that they cannot give them line of duty status or that they have to put the member back to work on restricted duty. We often disagree with the idea that they "have to" do something or "cannot" do something else. It is more accurately a situation where they "will not" do or "grant" something. But that is within their rights as well. It is okay for there to be disagreement if the subsequent process is followed fairly by all parties.

If the result is disagreement, we advise all members that it is not a situation that should immediately become confrontational or adversarial. The negotiated process was put in place over 25 years ago to deal with the disagreement. We tell clients at that point to simply state that his or her doctor is telling them something different, and they want to avail themselves of the Medical Review process. This is when the formal request for Medical Review takes place with the Medical Administration Office (MAO). Also, when a member requests Medical Review, he/she should immediately inform his/her PBA delegate and/or their trustee because the process will involve the PBA as well as the Department. If we are unaware of someone going through Medical Review (which surprisingly happens more times than we like), the PBA and our office cannot advise the member appropriately. As disability counsel to the PBA, we play a significant role in the process. If we are not aware that you are going through the Medical Review process, we cannot advocate on your behalf. For example, all the medical evidence favorable to you might not be considered if we do not participate.

Once Medical Review is requested, the procedure dictated by the Memorandum of Understanding is that a telephone conversation take place between the Police

Surgeon and the member's physician to see if the two can reach agreement on the issue. Be aware that your doctor will get this call, so it is very important that your doctor is made aware of this fact. If the member's physician and the Police Surgeon agree, then Medical Review is over. Obviously if there is agreement that the injury was sustained in the line of duty, then the officer's line of duty status is approved. If there is agreement that the injury did not occur in the line of duty, the officer is denied line of duty status. We do not have actual statistics, but based on our anecdotal experience with these matters, often the doctors are unable to reach an agreement. The next step is that an appointment is made for the officer to visit "a neutral third-party doctor," who after examining the officer and reviewing all pertinent medical records will make a written recommendation to the Commissioner of Police. In the absence of including us in the Medical Review process, the Police Department alone will submit medical records to the neutral thirdparty doctor, which is detrimental to the police officer's case. Further, the Police Surgeon, or MAO, will provide a written report to the neutral third-party doctor of its evaluation of the case. If we are not consulted by the police officer who has requested Medical Review, or by that officer's delegate or trustee, we cannot provide the police officer's position of his/her case and relate the medical evidence to that position. It is obvious that if the police officer does not submit an evaluation of his/ her case to the neutral third-party doctor, he/she is at a distinct disadvantage at this stage of Medical Review.

Over time, attrition left us with only one doctor remaining on the list of neutral doctors agreed to by the PBA and the Department many years ago. After some negotiation, the PBA and the Department were able to agree on a new list of doctors in a wide array of medical specialties to address Medical Reviews going forward. As compared to the Workers' Compensation IME process whose doctor is paid for entirely by the County and is not "independent" as the name might suggest, the neutral third-party doctor is presumably completely neutral and independent because the doctor's fee is split equally between the PBA and the Department. Thus, we can compile all the medical evidence relevant to the determination in conjunction with the Department to make sure that ALL evidence is presented to the neutral doctor, not just the Police Surgeon's opinion and evidence.

The beauty of this contractual process is that the decision of the neutral third-party doctor should be the final determination on this issue, for better or for worse. Granted, the Commissioner can adopt the opinion of the neutral third-party doctor or not, so the reason for the MOU is to alleviate the Commissioner from making a medical determination on a medical issue. Therefore, the doctor should be making the decision, so that opinion is usually the final step in the process.

Occasionally, the neutral third-party doctor's opinion does leave some remaining questions which should then lead to further discussion between the PBA and MAO on a particular issue. For this reason, making sure that your representatives are involved in the process is important because otherwise they cannot continue to advocate for the position that best protects the member. You should be aware that recently, after the neutral third-party doctor sent a very favorable (to the police officer) report to the Commissioner, MAO then sent a video to the neutral third-party doctor to see if the video changed the doctor's opinion in any way. To his credit, the doctor was not intimidated by the two (2) detectives that brought the video and did not change his opinion in any meaningful way. We have noted the process should be fair, which means that all existing medical and nonmedical evidence is to be sent to the neutral third-party doctor prior to the police officer's appointment. In this case the video existed well before the member went to the examination, but was not shown to the doctor until AFTER the doctor submitted his report. The Medical Review process provides that ONLY NEW is to be submitted to the neutral third-party doctor. This should clearly demonstrate the importance of our involvement in the Medical Review process.

As always, we wish you all the best and a safe beginning to the New Year. However, we know the realities of the job, and injuries will occur. The key to this article is to know that if there is disagreement with the Police Surgeon such as they tell you that they "have" to put you back to work on restricted assignment, and your doctor disagrees and believes that you need to be home entirely to recover, you absolutely have the right to push back on that Police Surgeon's opinion and by availing yourself of Medical Review!

FIRST PRECINCT TOP COP AWARD AUGUST 2020

On August 19, 2020, at approximately 1720 hours, Police Officer Gironda and Police Officer Sutch of the first precinct special patrol unit were conducting crime deterrent patrol in Roosevelt when they observed the Defendant secrete a large clear plastic bag inside of his shorts. The Defendant entered his vehicle and abruptly pulled away from the curb, the officers while following behind observed the Defendant commit multiple VTL violations. The Officers attempted to pull the vehicle over and the Defendant started driving erratically at a high rate of speed and immediately crashed into the rear of another vehicle on the southern state parkway. The Defendant continued driving on the shoulder of the parkway and was observed throwing a black fanny pack out the side window later determined to contain cocaine and a loaded .45 caliber Taurus semi-automatic handgun with one round in the chamber and 7 additional rounds of ammunition in the magazine. The Defendant did then jump out of the moving vehicle and a foot chase ensued. The Defendant was then observed throwing a clear plastic bag which later was found to contain approximately 5.4 ounces of cocaine. With the assistance of other Officers, the Defendant was placed into custody were \$2,860.00 in currency was recovered. A search of the Defendants vehicle contained a bullet resistant vest, 3 bags of marijuana and two boxes of fireworks.

Due to Officer Gironda & Sutch's quick response, tactics and observation skills they placed a very violent Defendant under arrest. The defendant was charged with violation of Penal Law 220.18 Criminal Possession of Controlled Substance 2nd (A Felony), Penal Law 265.03- Criminal Possession Weapon 2nd: Loaded Firearm. The Top Cop Committee is proud to have Police Officer Gironda and Police Officer Sutch as the Top Cop of the First Precinct for the month of August 2020.

FIRST PRECINCT TOP COP AWARD SEPTEMBER 2020

On September 6, 2020, at approximately 0252 hours, Police Officers responded to the rear of 455 Jerusalem Ave, Uniondale. A 911 caller stated that a heavy set dark black male wearing a hat sitting in the front passenger seat, a thin build dark female wearing glasses sitting in the driver's seat, and a thin build dark black male

wearing chains standing outside the driver side with the door open. The caller further stated that the black male wearing the hat in the front passenger did take a firearm from the glove box, take out the magazine and then reinsert it, and then rack the slide. PO Rooney, PO Mcallister and PO Conley approached the two individuals standing next to the Nissan Altima. PO Margolnick after getting consent and smelling an odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle did then remove the Defendant from the front passenger seat where he was seated. PO Margolnick did open the glove box and recover a loaded magazine. PO Fagan subsequently recovered a bag of marijuana in the center console and a 9mm pistol located inside a camera bag stuffed into a cooler, in the second row of seats behind the driver's seat. PO Rooney, PO Mcallister and PO Conley then searched the Altima. Officer Rooney recovered a zip lock bag containing 10 spade shape pills in various colors believed to be ecstasy, 4 plastic containers with a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, numerous clear empty plastic bags known for carrying narcotics and a scale found in a pink string back pack in the truck. Due to Officers quick response, tactics and observation skills they placed a very violent Defendant under arrest. The Defendant was charged with violation of PL-265.02 (01)- Criminal possession weapon 3rd: Previous conviction and PL 265.03(03) - Criminal possession weapon 2nd: Loaded firearm outside home and PL 265.01-B(01)- Criminal Possession of a Firearm. The Top Cop Committee is proud to have Police Officers Michael Rooney, Brian Mcallister and Kevin Conley as the Top Cop of the First Precinct for the month of September 2020.

FIRST PRECINCT TOP COP AWARD OCTOBER 2020

On October 4, 2020, at approximately 0452 hours, Police Officers observed a Gray BMW sitting at a traffic light for 2 cycles without moving. Officers approached the vehicle to check on the well-being of the Defendant who appeared to be sleeping at the wheel, while his car was in drive and his foot on the brake. In plain view a handgun was observed on the lap of the Defendant. Officers gained entry to the vehicle and secured the loaded firearm. The Defendant was intoxicated and driving with 7 suspensions on his license. After a search of the Defendant and his vehicle approximately \$19,538.00 in US Currency, an additional loaded magazine and 214 grams of marihuana was recovered.

Due to Officers quick response, tactics and observation skills they placed a very violent Defendant under arrest. The Defendant was charged with violation of PL 265.02 – Criminal Possession of Weapon 3rd with a previous conviction, PL 165.45 – Criminal Possession Stolen Property 4th: Firearm, PL 221-15 Criminal Possession of Marihuana 4th, PL 265.03 Criminal Possession of Weapon 2nd: Loaded Firearm outside of home, PL

265.01-Criminal Possession Firearm possess a firearm, VTL 511.3A- Aggravated Unlicensed Operation with Alcohol (Class E Felony) and multiple VTL violations. The Top Cop Committee is proud to have Police Officers Philip Buonora and Christopher Carney as the Top Cop of the First Precinct for the month of October 2020.

I want to thank all of the members who attended Arties Memorial this past October. It means the world to ESU and the Lopez family for the support you all showed. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts.



As you have all read in my previous newsletters, ESU has more than doubled the size of the unit in 24 months from 19 cops and 3 supervisors to 42 cops and 5 supervisors. This has been a daunting task for the senior supervisors, senior cops and the training staff in the unit. It has been a massive learning curve with some bumps in the road but so far it has worked out very well for the unit. We moved in a positive direction and we are now able to assist the cops on the street at a faster and safer rate by having four trucks in service during the day (one per frequency), and the unit is able to grow some experience at a faster rate. So I want to thank the supervisors for believing in all of us and the senior men

in the unit who have worked hard to take 28 cops and 3 supervisors under their wings on the street and help show the tips and tricks to getting the job done in a safe and effective way.

ESU as a whole requires a variety of equipment and training with all of it. We use and train with rope rescue, to extrication equipment, air bags, tow equipment, animal handling/equipment, elevator rescues, hand/ power tools, heavy vests and helmets, water/ice rescue and so on. Without this equipment ESU would be driving around in a Ford F550 billboard with limited resources. Within the past year ESU had the opportunity to put in for vital new technology equipment purchased through Asset Forfeiture. Without the support of our upper supervision, these requests would not have become made a reality. Everyone involved from our current administrative supervisor Sgt. Keith Faivre, our former C.O. of Highway Patrol, Lt. Mike Franco, Chief Mullane (at the time our Inspector) who backed our training with the new equipment, Chief Canavan and Chief Lack who always had our support in bringing the purchase requests up to the Legislature and defending the need for the equipment and Chief Palmer who has signed off on the paperwork and supported this positive growth of members and equipment. A special thanks to all of the members of Asset Forfeiture, and Chief of Patrols office staff who have put up with my questions on numerous occasions and going through all of the requests. Finally, a big thank you to Commissioner Ryder who is and always has been a huge advocate of the Emergency Service Unit. We can not thank you enough for your support!

These calls are usually few and far between but when it rains it pours! This is why training on new equipment is important, not only during inservice but constantly pulling things off the trucks and re-familiarizing yourself.

Overall Top Cops

PO Joseph Calamita, Shield #3769, Serial #9274 PO Daniel Ibanez, Shield# 3853, Serial #9456 PO Gregory Fisher, Shield #4077, Serial 9550

Third Precinct Special Detail Officers, Joseph Calamita, Daniel Ibanez and Gregory Fisher were responsible for a total of 338 arrests in 2020. Of the 338 arrests, 114 were Felonies, 160 Misdemeanors and 64 were Violations. These arrests were compromised of 25 DWI's, 25 drug related arrests, 109 Forged Instruments (Credit Cards, Registrations, Licenses) and 32 Warrant arrests. In addition to this high level of arrest activity, in which 243 of the arrests resulted from self-initiated activity, these Officers also issued a total of 1,104 VTL Summons's.

Their hard work resulted in removing a loaded firearm from the street and the arrest of a male subject responsible for publicly exposing himself to females and minors on five previous occasions, after months of intensive patrols of the vicinity where these crimes occurred.

While investigating an unrelated stabbing involving teen gang members at the Roosevelt Field Mall, the Officers were responsible for disrupting an organized flash shoplifting mob from Bloomingdales. Officers were surveilling suspicious vehicles that were parked outside when the mob of ten to twelve individuals came running out of the store carrying \$61,370 worth of stolen merchandise. Officers intercepted the mob and were able to recover \$22,740 worth of the merchandise, arrested one of the subjects and seized one of the getaway vehicles. The subsequent investigation by Third Squad Detectives is ongoing and several other responsible involved persons are expected to be arrested.

Due to the consistently high level of activity these Officers have produced, and their devotion to crime suppression in our County, The PBA is proud to call these Officers our Overall Top Cops for 2020.

On February 25, 2020 at approximately 1030 hours, the defendant committed an armed carjacking in Garden City Park, N.Y. The defendant placed a loaded 9mm handgun to the victim's head and fled the scene with his vehicle. Upon hearing the notification of the incident, Officers Alejandro Perez and Peter Lang of the Bureau of Special Operations began to canvass the area in search of the defendant. The unoccupied vehicle was located in Queens.

Third Squad Detectives obtained the identity of the defendant and informed the BSO officers of his violent criminal past which included assaulting police officers, possession of a firearm, attempted murder and several bank robberies. Officers Perez and Lang set up surveillance at the residence where the vehicle was located. A male wearing a hoodie exited the residence and entered a different vehicle in front of the residence. Officers John Giovaniello and Robert Psomas arrived at scene. At this time, the Officers positively identified the male with the hoodie as the subject of the carjacking. The Officers pursued the defendant a short distance and he abruptly stopped in the roadway. Officers Lang and Perez exited their unmarked unit, identified themselves and ordered the defendant out of his vehicle while informing him he was under arrest. The defendant was observed reaching into the center console for what turned out to be a loaded 9mm handgun. While doing so, the defendant sped backwards, striking Officers Psomas and Giovaniello's unmarked unit. The defendant then drove forward off the roadway and onto the sidewalk striking Officer Lang who was positioned there. The defendant continued to accelerate as Officer Lang was thrown onto the hood of the defendant's vehicle and began to roll off. Believing that officer Lang was about to get run over or crushed between the vehicle and the building which was several feet away, Officer Perez fired his service weapon at the defendant in an attempt to stop him. Officer Lang while pushing off the hood of the defendant's vehicle, also fired his service weapon at the defendant. The defendant once again attempted to strike Officer Lang with his vehicle. Officers Giovaniello and Psomas, who had now positioned themselves around the defendant's vehicle, attempted to stop the defendant's aggressive actions by also firing their service weapons at the defendant. The defendant's vehicle violently crashed into a hair salon storefront, shattering the front glass window. Officers Jeff Toscano and Emil Knight, who were also surveilling the defendant's residence, arrived on scene and physically removed the defendant from the vehicle. At this time, it was evident that the defendant had succumbed to his injuries.

Meritorious

Police Officer Gregory Nordquist, Shield # 3843, Serial # 9445 Police Officer Evan O'Brien, Shield #3227, Serial # 10081

On September 16, 2020 at approximately 0025 hours, a male victim was contacted by friends who informed him that there were two unknown subjects in the front yard of his residential fenced in property located in Elmont. The concerned victim, and his friends responded to the residence where they observed the two males on his property and confronted them.

The two subjects fled the front yard on foot and were followed by the victim and his friends. The subjects then entered a gray Toyota Rav 4 which was driven by a third subject. The victim and his friends called 911 for assistance in stopping the subjects who had entered his yard without permission. The victim and his friends got into the victim's vehicle, a Hyundai Santa Fe, and followed the subject's vehicle. The subject's vehicle struck the victims vehicle and the subjects fired four gun shots at the victim and his friends.

Police Officer Gregory Nordquist while on routine patrol and unaware of this ongoing incident, heard what he believed to be gun shots. Officer Nordquist responded to the direction of where he had heard the shots. Officer Nordquist observed the Gray Toyota Rav4 traveling at a high rate of speed from the direction in which he originally heard the gun shots. He activated his lights and sirens and attempted to pull over the vehicle. The operator of the subject vehicle refused to stop and a short pursuit ensued and the subjects were able to evade the pursuing patrol car.

The vehicle was located a short time later in Valley Stream. During a canvas of the area, Officer O'Brien observed a male fitting the description of one of the subjects from the vehicle. The male was walking down the street and Officer O,Brien exited his vehicle in an attempt to stop the subject. The subject saw the officers and ran from him and a foot pursuit ensued. At some point, the subject fell to the ground and a black .45 Caliber Tanfoglio pistol fell out of the defendant's waistband and a live round was released from the pistol chamber due to the impact. Due to the proximity of the handgun to the subject, Officer Evan O'Brien utilized his taser in an attempt to temporarily incapacitate the subject. One of the taser prongs hit the defendant's leg and the other prong missed him, not allowing the taser to function properly. The Officers immediately grabbed the subject, pulled him away from the handgun and placed him under arrest.

The defendant was charged with Attempted Murder and reckless endangerment. If not for the superior determination of these Officers, this dangerous subject would likely have not been arrested for his actions, it is our honor to name Officers Nordquist and O'Brien as our Top Cops of the year.

Lifesaver

Police Officer Neal Krauszer, Shield# 3977, Serial# 9380 Police Officer Ashley Corwin, Shield# 2333, Serial# 9829 AMT Scott Russell, Shield # 113, Serial# 4464C

On March 6, 2020 at approximately 1840 hours, Police Officer Cody Pelcher was attending turnout at the First Precinct Stationhouse when he suffered a medical emergency, causing him to pass out and fall to the floor. Several Officers jumped into action and attempted to render aid and summoned an ambulance. The Communications Bureau dispatched an ambulance to respond for what was originally believed to be a seizure. NCPD Police Medic Scott Russell was responding to a different aided case at the time, but was currently traveling in very close proximity to the First Precinct. He advised that he would switch assignments and respond to the First Precinct instead of his original assignment. Upon arrival, Officer Pelcher was immediately moved onto a stretcher and placed into the ambulance. As the ambulance responded to the hospital, AMT Russell continued to assess Officer Pelcher with the assistance of Police Officers Krauszer and Corwin. Officer Pelcher's condition worsened and he suffered a Cardiac arrest. AMT Russell and Officers Krauszer and Corwin immediately administered CPR. An AED was utilized to administer an electric shock to Officer Pelcher, in an attempt to get his heart beating again. The initial shock and several more shock attempts were unsuccessful. CPR continued during the entire transport to the hospital. Upon arrival to the hospital, Officer Pelcher was rushed into the trauma room and the trauma team was able to successfully shock Officer Pelcher and he regained a pulse. Officer Pelcher remained in the hospital for approximately eight days where he had an internal defibrillator surgically implanted. Officer Pelcher has since returned to work and has made a full recovery. Thanks to the quick actions of these honorees, Officer Pelcher is alive today.

Top Detective

Detective James Schmettan, Shield # 1246, Serial # 8504

On November 1, 2019 several Blood gang members shot 19 rounds into a house located in Massapequa Park. Detective James Schmettan and other Detectives were able to identify the subjects involved and placed them into custody. The investigation revealed that the subjects were involved in 12 other shootings throughout Long Island. It was also discovered that two of the subjects were trafficking firearms from Alabama. Search warrants led to the confiscation of four firearms and an additional three firearms were recovered during a car stop. All three subjects were indicted on Attempted Murder and firearm related charges. Detective Schmettan secured two written statements of admission regarding their involvement in gang related gun violence and drug activity. Information discovered during the course of this investigation has led to several more indictments and branched out to additional cases that are being investigated jointly with the Federal Government.

On September 1, 2020 an unknown subject shot 20 rounds at three victims. One of the victims suffered multiple gunshot wounds. The victims and witnesses were uncooperative with the investigation. On October 5, 2020 a Crip gang member, who was believed to be the shooter, was arrested on an unrelated incident. The subject was interviewed and gave a full statement of admission stating that he was the shooter of the September 1st incident. The subject was

charged with Attempted Murder, Criminal Possession of a Weapon and Reckless Endangerment. The investigation of this case led to the arrests in two other related gang shootings.

From April 18 2019 through October 2020, Detective Schmettan, aided by the use of Confidential Informants, conducted six separate controlled purchases of firearms, netting a total of seven hand guns. These gun buys involved known gang members and are a part of a larger gun trafficking investigation.

The results of his excellent work has earned him the right to be called the PBA's Top Detective of the Year.

Top Supervisor

First Precinct Sergeant William Iger

On December 1, 2019 at approximately 0630 hours, First Precinct units were assigned to an assault that just occurred in Uniondale. First Precinct Sergeant William Iger, who arrived for work only minutes before, quickly responded to the scene, where a female victim was walking to the bus stop, when a male subject tackled her from behind and attempted to steal her pocketbook. The victim struggled with the subject, who then fled the scene on foot.

The subject then entered a nearby residence through an unlocked rear window, but was confronted by the homeowner and fled the scene. The homeowner called 911 to report the incident and gave a physical description of the subject that matched the described subject from the assault that occurred ten minutes prior.

The subject then entered another residence through a rear unlocked door. Once inside, the subject entered the bedroom of a 9-year-old child and put a knife to his throat. He then brought the child to his mothers' bedroom, where the boy's mother pleaded with the subject not to hurt her son and asked him what he wanted. The subject said he wanted sex and attempted to rape her, but then fled the home when he heard voices of other family members in the house.

At this time, Sergeant Iger observed the subject running and entering through the gate of a rear yard. Sergeant Iger ordered the subject to stop, but the subject refused his order and jumped over a fence that led to an adjoining yard. Sergeant Iger immediately jumped the fence and continued his pursuit over more fencing and through several yards, all while advising the other units of his location and direction of travel. The pursuit continued to Uniondale Avenue where two awaiting First Precinct Officers confronted the subject who was armed with a knife. The Officers drew their weapons and ordered the subject to drop the knife. He complied and Sergeant Iger tackled the subject to the ground and placed him into custody with the assistance of several First Precinct Officers.

The subject was positively identified by all victims and was charged with multiple serious crimes. Sergeant Igers quick actions and unrelenting pursuit of the subject, who posed serious danger to the public, earns him the honor of being named our Top Supervisor of the Year.

Perseverance Award

Police Officer James Viviani, Shield # 2587, Serial # 8209

On March 12, 2020, at the beginning of the Covid Pandemic, Police Officer James Viviani began experiencing Flu like symptoms. He was tested and was confirmed to have Covid. He isolated himself at home in an attempt to recover, but his physical condition deteriorated over the next six days. He woke up on March 18, 2020 in raspatory distress and was transported to Good Samaritan Hospital via ambulance.

At the time, Covid was a new, unknown virus and there was very little research to determine effective treatment for the virus. After spending the next couple days in the hospital and not responding to the treatment he was given, his condition rapidly declined and he was rushed to the Intensive Care Unit. James found it extremely difficult to breathe, even while receiving 100% oxygen. The medical staff informed him that if he could not raise his oxygen levels, that they would have to put him on a ventilator. James, knowing that going on a ventilator could cause long term lung issues, spent the next 15 days concentrating on his breathing and was eventually able to increase his oxygen level and avoid being put in the ventilator. During that time, the medical staff experimented with certain types of treatment that were currently showing some success in treating this new virus and administered two different types of antibiotics, a drug normally used for treating Malaria, and a steroid.

James was eventually moved out of ICU and was released from the hospital on April 7, 2020. He was sent home with an oxygen tank to assist with his breathing. After recouping at home over the next month, he returned to work on June 4th, 2020 in a light duty capacity. After taking into consideration the health scare he experienced over the last several months, James reevaluated his future and made the decision to retire on August 28th, 2020.

Officer Viviani's ability to struggle through a deadly illness, with little known treatment at the time, has earned him the PBA Perseverance Award for 2020.

Man of the Year

Congressman Peter King

Peter King started his political career in 1977 as a Town of Hempstead Councilman. In 1981, he was elected Nassau County Comptroller and went on to be re-elected in 1985 and 1989. Peter was first elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1992. Congressman King served for 14 consecutive terms, from 1993 till the end of 2020 when he retired. He was a longtime resident of Nassau County and the son of a New York City Police Officer. In all his time as a public Official, he has been a huge supporter of Law Enforcement, both on the local and national level. He constantly and publicly reinforces his commitment to Police Officers everywhere. His support has always been appreciated by the members of this union and his support has earned him the right to be called the Nassau Police Benevolent Associations Man of the Year.

Periodically, your PBA reminds its membership of appropriate steps that should be taken if you are called to Internal Affairs or become part of ANY department investigation. Recent events underscore the importance of involving the PBA and your legal counsel, me, as soon as possible.

Should you be called to Internal Affairs, be it as a witness or subject, you must notify your local PBA representative IMMEDIATELY. If you are deemed a subject, you have the right to have both a union representative and legal counsel with you during the interview. If the investigation is criminal in nature, call me first!

REMEMBER: You must be afforded a reasonable amount of time to contact a PBA representative and attorney. You have the right to confer with us both before and after questioning.

YOUR PBA REPRESENTATIVES AND ATTORNEY ARE HERE TO PROTECT YOU!

In any situation, be it at Internal Affairs or otherwise, where you are asked to write a letter and there is even a remote possibility of discipline, be sure to begin the letter with the following statement:

"I am making this statement for administrative purposes only. I have not done so voluntarily, but in compliance with an order of a Superior Officer. This statement in no way constitutes any waiver of my rights, and this statement, or any part thereof, may not be used against me in any subsequent criminal proceeding."

Finally, upon notifying your PBA representative that you have been called to Internal Affairs as the subject of an investigation, we will arrange to meet prior to your interview at my office to review the facts and circumstances.
