

President's Message

HAPPY NEW YEAR TO ALL!

Each New Year brings hope for better things and this year is no different. This past year saw the end of the wage freeze, with longevity still frozen until a reasonable solution can be agreed upon. The wage freeze settlement allows the Police Unions to continue the lawsuit both in State and Federal Courts that 1- Challenges NIFA's authority to freeze wages in State Court. 2- If the State Court 2nd Department Appellant states they have the authority to freeze wages our federal lawsuit challenges whether NIFA abused their authority to freeze wages. We can only move back to the Federal Court once the State Court process has completed and only if we do not prevail in State Court (It wouldn't be necessary to return to Federal Court if the State rules NIFA had no authority to freeze wages).

There is still much more work to be accomplished as we move forward. Since the wage freeze in March 2011 the department has been depleted of hundreds of veteran police officers, experienced detectives and supervisors. While all that remain are doing a great job under difficult circumstances and times, much more needs to be done by the department to restore units that have been dismantled or downsized. The department is starting to hire more police officers to start to rebuild, while at the same time retirements

will be increasing. I have spoken to the legislature about the need to re-establish the Plain clothes anti-crime units, POP units and enforcement patrols in the precincts. In addition Narco-Vice manpower has to be increased to combat the ever growing Heroin epidemic that is destroying families and the lives of our young people. These are all necessary tools to keep crime suppressed and ensure the quality of life Nassau County residents have come to enjoy and expect.

All of our Police Officers, Detectives and Supervisors do a great job day in and day out protecting the residents of Nassau County and we can never let the media's attack on the police nationwide deter us from continuing to do our best out there each day. We have a social contract with the public here in Nassau County and no matter how bad things may be, the one thing that I am most proud of is compliments I receive from many who praise the professional service each and everyone provides to the public during their work day. Continue to treat the public with the utmost respect and we will never lose their respect.

NASSAU COUNTY PBA TOP COPS FOR 2014

At the PBA Holiday party the following were named our Top Cops, Supervisor and Detectives of the year. These recipients were also honored by the Nassau County Legislature on December 15, 2014 where their outstanding service was recognized.

Life Saving Award:

Police Officer James Duignan Police Officer Scott Thiel

Officers Duignan and Thiel of the Third Precinct responded to an assignment for a house fire within the Third Precinct. Upon arrival they found a fully involved working house fire. Being advised that there were people inside and without hesitation, the Officers entered the burning home. They located two occupants of the home pulling them to safety. Both aided persons were unconscious and CPR was performed on them. They were able to revive one of the homes occupants who recovered fully. These Officers showed a total disregard for their own safety and wellbeing to rescue these individuals and had it not been for their courageous actions, both occupants would have surely perished.

Meritorious Award:

Police Officer Victor Gladitz Police Officer Keri-Ann Hoovert Police Officer Charles Volpe

Officers Gladitz, Volpe and Hoovert while working within the confines of the Fifth Precinct received an assignment for a Robbery at a high end car dealership. Three individuals armed with handguns entered a car dealership and committed a violent Robbery and fled the scene in a waiting auto with a fourth subject driving. The Officers quickly respond-

ed to scene and observed a vehicle matching the description of the subjects' vehicle and a pursuit ensued. The Officers after a brief vehicle and subsequent foot pursuit were able to apprehend the subjects and recover the weapons used and the proceeds from the Robbery.

Distinguished Service Award:

Police Officer David Desenchak Police Officer Kevin Vahey Police Officer Nicholas Brando Police Officer Kevin Higbie

Officers Desenchak, Vahey, Brando and Higbie assigned to the Bureau of Special Operations (BSO) were in plainclothes in unmarked vehicles attempting to locate a subject involved in a home invasion Robbery. They located the subjects' vehicle which the subject entered a short time later. The Officers approached the subject and identified themselves as Police Officers giving him directions and orders which he refused. The subject in an attempt to flee the officers struck the vehicles parked in front of him and behind him. The subject then drove directly and deliberately at Officer Brando striking him and pinning him between the subjects' and another vehicle. The subject then drove onto the sidewalk nearly striking Officer Higbie who discharged his firearm striking the subject. The subject continued to flee for a short distance but was stopped by the Officers including Officer Brando who even after suffering serious leg injuries was able to get into his unmarked car and pursue the subject who was taken into custody.

Overall Top Cops:

Police Officer Donald Johnson Police Officer Carl Tedeschi

Police Officers Johnson and Tedeschi of the First Precinct working a two man unit show a consistent level of high activity with 138 arrests consisting of arrests of subjects for Burglary, Robbery, Larcenies, Assaults, Drugs and Weapons. They had eleven (11) arrests for DWI and issued hundreds of summonses. Their work ethic and dedication to patrol make the community which they serve a safer place.

Top Supervisor Award:

Sergeant Scott Bertini

Sgt Bertini of the Second Precinct while on patrol responded to an assignment for a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival he spoke to a female at the residence that stated she was involved in a disturbance with her husband and that he had left the house. Sgt Bertini attempting to locate the husband entered the backyard finding the subject seated in a lawn chair holding a handgun. The subject was distraught and threatening suicide. Sgt Bertini was able to start a dialogue with the subject and after speaking with him for some time was able to convince him to put down his weapon and surrender himself.

Top Detectives Award:

Detective William Brosnan Detective Gonzalo Londono Detective Michael Maloney

Detectives Brosnan, Londono and Maloney of the Homicide Squad are recognized for their investigation into the shooting death of Police Officer Arthur Lopez and Mr Raymond Facey. Their tireless work and dedication into identifying and connecting the subject to this horrific crime ensured a conviction of the subject and brought a killer to justice, putting him behind bars where he belongs.

Treasurer's Report

Insurance Plan Changes

As chairman of the insurance committee I just wanted to keep everyone up to date on some important changes to the group insurance plan that is administered by the PBA. The contract with "The Standard Insurance Company" expired in December. The Company offered a renewal with a 60% increase in premium! Hard to believe, but true. For as long as I have been managing the plan the claims experience for the retired members has been greater than the premiums paid for the coverage. That makes renewal without increases difficult at best.

New Insurance Company

As of January 1, 2015 all life insurance coverage will be switched to "MetLife". In the following weeks you will be receiving a summary of coverage from "Metlife". You will not be required to take any action unless you wish to change your coverage.

Changes for Retiring Members

The main factor causing such poor claims experience is that the current plan design for those who have already retired has allowed everyone to keep coverage until date of death. Unfortunately, our group does not generate enough premium to sustain that type of coverage. As a result the insurance committee has been forced to make changes for future retirees in order to ensure the plan's future success.

Beginning January 1, 2015 all future retirees will only have the option of the group coverage till age 70.

In case you are not aware, the amount of coverage offered in the group plan drops at retirement. For those who are less than 60 years of age the coverage drops to \$50,000 then again at age 60 to \$20,000. The group policy is a great and economical way to supplement your insurance coverage while you are active but is not a vehicle for permanent coverage. Each of you should consult an agent to determine what plan may fit your long term insurance needs.

New Benefit with "Metlife"

All members will now be offered a guaranteed issue insurance policy from "metlife" at retirement. The amount and cost will be provided to you at the time of retirement since rates are based on age and coverage.

Legal Report

For those that are familiar with our practice, we pride ourselves as a full service disability law firm. That means that as much as we might hope that an injured police officer may only have a minor injury that allows him to return to work promptly, we are always prepared for the unfortunate reality that some injuries are career ending. In fact, some injuries are so devastating that not only will it end an officer's career in law enforcement but also render him disabled from any work within the national economy. The Disability Pension process takes care of the issue of disability from law enforcement, but for the question of disability from the whole range of work within the economy, Social Security Disability takes that question into account. Thankfully, as a full service disability firm, we handle those cases as well.

As with any area of law, there are some serious misconceptions about Social Security Disability. We hope this month to dispel some of the more prevalent ones.

The first major misconception we see is that members hear that if they can prove they can no longer be a police officer then they will be awarded Social Security benefits (in addition to a possible Disability Pension). Pension application is predicated on the main issue of whether a member is permanently disabled from the full duties of a police officer. Other factors such as age and education level really do not play a tangible role in a ¾ or ½ disability claims as the only issue is can the member do the job. However, Social Security Disability uses a much broader analysis in determining eligibility for the benefit. In fact, the term "disability" is only one component to the analysis of a claim. More accurately, Social Security is analyzing the "employability" of the person within the context of the entire national economy. That analysis of "employability" takes into account every factor involved with work abilities such as age, education, past relevant training, and physical or mental restrictions caused by a condition or conditions. Thus, it is conceivable that a member may be quite obviously disabled from performing the full duties of a police officer, but he may be young enough and educated enough to perform other work in the national economy. For example, a 40 year old, college educated police officer with a severe back impairment and maybe even a lumbar fusion might be unable to perform his job as a police officer, but that member would have to prove to Social Security that he also could not be a security consultant or even a data entry clerk. Also, consider the case of full duty versus restricted assignment police work. As you have seen, if filed timely, the only question for a Disability Pension application should be whether the member is permanently disabled from the full duties of a police officer. Therefore, while the application is pending, the officer can work restricted assignment without any affect upon his Disability Pension claim. For Social Security, the ability to be a restricted assignment officer is enough to deny the claim and halt it in its tracks because the analysis is about work ability overall,

not a particular job title. For some, this analysis can be heartless and insulting when placed in that context but knowing this misconception before going into the process is important.

The second major misconception that we see on a regular basis is that if you are awarded a disability pension, whether it is an Accidental Disability Pension or Performance of Duty, that Social Security will automatically approve that application as well on the basis of being approved for a ¾ or ½ disability pension. That certainly is not true. The very nature and distinctions between the two benefits makes that apparent on its face. The likely cause of the misconception is the word "disability" in both benefits. That really is where the similarities end. The two claims ask entirely different questions as shown above. However, they are claims that may be running simultaneously and sound similar. The one key thing to keep in mind is that one benefit is predicated on a member's ability to do police work while one is predicated on ability or inability to work over all. Plus, one agency typically does not want to be told to do something simply because another agency has made a determination. Each agency will make its own determination using its own criteria. In an ideal world, a finding of "disabled" by one agency would be like a chain of dominoes beginning to fall. However, each system (including Workers' Compensation) must be developed in its own style and fashion to answer the specific question being asked.

Another common question that arises concerning Social Security Disability and other benefits our office procures on behalf of applicants is the tax status of the benefit. As you know, Accidental Disability and Performance of Duty Disability Pension benefits are tax free. Workers' Compensation benefits are also tax free. Social Security benefits, on the other hand, are a taxable benefit. In fact, when computing the tax rate for the benefit, Social Security will also take into account the amount received from a Disability Pension (even though that pension might be tax free). Thus, when focusing on the fixed income coming into the household once all claims are concluded, the tax implications also need to be taken into account as the member moves forward.

As you can see, there are endless amounts of moving parts that can be discussed when looking at the various claims our office handles for members. The major takeaway from this information should be that different information and medical opinions will have a different effect on each of the claims pending for a member. Thus, a member may have one terrible, on duty accident that ends his career. There is no guarantee without the proper development that the member will end up with every benefit that he or she may be entitled to. Understanding the pitfalls is the key to overcoming them.

TOP COPS

Congratulations to Steve Ben Jacob and Tristan Cetto on being voted fifth precinct Top Cops for October, 2014. Here's the scenario ...

The officers respond on a call in Elmont for a suspicious person armed with a gun. Upon arrival and interview of the victim, they are advised that a man had broken the window to his apartment and fled scene in a green taxi. While the officers are gathering further information, a green taxi passes the location which the victim identifies as being similar to the one the subject fled in. The officers follow the cab and conduct a car stop. When told to exit the vehicle, the subject put up a violent struggle, necessitating further units to control and place him into custody.

The subject was found to be in possession of a laptop computer, a wallet containing multiple credit cards issued in another person's name and drugs. He was charged with felony criminal mischief, possession of stolen property and resisting arrest, and upon further investigation, the property was found to be proceeds from multiple NYC robberies and home invasions. SIXTH PRECINCT TOP COPS OCTOBER 2014

On October 13, 2014 Police Officer Peter Chuchul and Police Officer Recruit Joseph Vazquez responded to a radio assignment for a serious aided case. Upon arrival the aided person was located and he was bleeding heavily with a serious laceration to his leg. The aided was using a gas powered saw to cut beams and when the saw kicked back slicing the aided persons left leg below the knee. Officer Chuchul had received training through the Department given by New York State Homeland Security in which he was trained in the use of a Tourniquet and Quick Clot Combat Gauze. With the assistance of Police Officer Vazquez a tourniquet was applied to the aided persons' leg. P.O Vazques administered Oxygen and kept time for the tourniquet. Other units and the Sea Cliff Fire Department responded and the Aided was airlifted to North Shore Hospital where doctors were able to save the persons leg only due to the quick actions of Officer Chuchul and Officer Vazquez.

HAPPY NEW YEAR! WELCOME TO 2015......

Ladies and Gentlemen start your engines, the school speed camera program has been killed by the very people who unanimously supported the implementation of these cameras. All the legislators were for this all important safety speed cameras in the 56 school districts across the county. You see they stated it was never about the money but about the safety of our children in school zones, and the money was ok too. When the program was first announced, the county government people stated that the cameras would be operable during school hours as well as a half hour before a school event, ending a half hour after the event ends. So in reality, these cameras could be operating 13,14, maybe 15 hours a day, Yikes!

Oops, phase one of the speed camera program had a little snafu to the tune of a 2.4 million dollar refund to ticketed drivers, the county was so anxious to get the cameras rolling they forgot to realize the schools were closed. Ok, this is Nassau County, these kind of things happen here. Phase two, the real roll out of the speed camera program, school is open and the cameras are ready to go. Well, as predicted and maybe not predicted the flashes start flashing and the tickets start hitting the mailboxes and the motoring public is outraged. How dare they be issued a speeding ticket, yes they were speeding but they didn't see any signs for a speed limit. So the county orders new signs to replace the old signs, these new ones come with flashing lights that say School Speed limit, and enforced by cameras. Would you believe the cameras kept flashing and the tickets kept hitting the mailboxes, and the motoring public was still

The motoring public had some valid complaints. I have lived in this community for 30 years, I never knew the school speed limit. I never knew there was a school there, my kids don't go to school there. Its impossible to go 20 miles per hour, I don't think 15 miles over the speed limit is a lot. I thought they were going to put the cameras by one of the other schools, and of course this is all about the coun-

ty doing a money grab.

The phone calls started and the protestors hit the streets crying afoul, that the speed cameras were not about safety but rather about money. The politicians started to get nervous, even Newsday who supported this legislation and the speed cameras began to back peddle and jump on the band wagon. Suffolk saw the uproar and the rebellion and was first to shelf their speed camera program. The Nassau Democrats stated they would present legislation to repeal the speed camera legislation and the Nassau Republicans started to get really nervous and vowed to repeal the speed cameras immediately. During that time the numbers were announced are the amount of violations issued. The amount of revenue that was generated in a matter of 2 months, 400,000 summons were issued for speeding in a school zone and the county's revenue share is \$24 million dollars. Oh and I failed to mention that to receive a summons you need to go 11 miles over the speed limit.

Well, on December 15, 2014 the county Legislature unanimously voted to repeal the school speed camera program, and the county executive, as of this writing, plans to sign the bill. Once again, this will create a hole in the budget to the tune of 30 million dollars, coupled with the sales tax predictions and the county could be looking at a 100 million dollar hole again. Oh and this November the entire Legislature is up for re-election, so there was no way they were going to suspend this and modify it so that it could enhance safety for our children and also continue a revenue stream, without increasing taxes. Like it or not folks, the motoring public thinks its ok to speed in a school zone and got the blessing from their elected officials. That's not OK! What a perfect time to bring back our enforcement details.

GOOD GRAB

On Thursday November 13, 2014 Bureau of Special Operation Officers Feil and Collins were asked by the 4th squad for assistance in locating a subject in which they had an open case on. On or about 1540 hours Police Officer Feil while operating unmarked vehicle 934 with BSO Police Officer Collins on Wanser Avenue in Inwood observed a four door grey 2011 Nissan Altima commit a Vehicle Traffic Law infraction, making a left turn without signaling at the intersection of Henry Street and Wanser Avenue in Inwood. Police Officer Collins and Police Officer Feil observed both occupants, the driver Joshua Lindsay and the front passenger Marcell Haynes, were not wearing their seat belts. Police Officer Feil activated his emergency lights and siren and directed the vehicle to stop. Police Officer Feil approached the driver side while Police Officer Collins approached the

passenger side. When Officer Feil approached the driver Joshua LIndsay he observed a small clear bag of Marihuana in plain view in the middle console of the vehicle. When Officer Collins approached the front passenger Marcell Haynes, he asked the defendant why he was not wearing his seatbelt. When defendant Haynes turned right to grab his seat belt, his jacket opened up and PO Collins observed the brown buttock and black hammer of a revolver in the right side of defendant Hayne's pants waistband. A black .38 special Smith and Wesson fully loaded with 6 rounds (maximum capacity) was recovered from defendant Hayne's waistband. During the investigation a bystander was observed by officer Collins to be the initial subject sought by the 4th squad. This subject was subsequently placed into custody. Defendant Hayne's was charged with 1 count of PL 265.02(1) and 1 count of PL 265.03(3); Defendant Haynes is currently under Parole Supervision by Queens I.

On November 20th 2014, Bureau of Special Operation Officers Donohue K. Rodriguez, and Coupe were on Stratcom for street robberies in the hamlet of Uniondale. At this time the officers conducted a VTL investigation where it was found that the passenger who was not wearing his seatbelt at the time was found to have an open warrant. The officers then conducted a Swift and RMS check on the driver where he was found to be involved in an open case for burglary a few years earlier. Both subjects were brought into custody and subject Barnes who was the driver of the vehicle confessed to committing 8 Burglaries back in 2009. Subject Barnes during the investigation brought BSO officers and 3rd squad detectives back to all the addresses of the residential houses he had burglarized. He also stated to detectives the he moved away from his home and fled to NYC to avoid being arrested. A total of 8 burglaries were closed out to the outstanding work of all the officers involved.

Zachary Cote, a 5 year old boy battling brain cancer, had his dreams come true when BSO officers David Brown and Mario Mastropierro along with Lieutenant Tara Comiskey visited him at Cohen Children's Medical Center in New Hyde Park. Zachary was first diagnosed with stage-four medulloblastoma, a highly malignant primary brain tumor that originates in the part of the brain. Although this had been a very hard and stressful time for Zachary and his family, with the help of the Bureau of Special Operations and Lt. Tara Comiskey they were able to bring a smile to this young boys face which they hadn't seen in a long time.
