President's Message

We have reviewed the Governor's veto message with regards to the steps legislation. There are three main components that were mentioned in the veto message. Upon review, we feel that two components can be dealt with immediately, and the third can be dealt with in the coming months. We have had bills in the same situation vetoed in the past and we kept submitting and working on them until they were ultimately passed into law. While the current situation may be frustrating, rest assured, we will continue this fight.

The PBA has made, and will continue, to make this issue a top priority. We fully intend to re-introduce the legislation and we are going to be meeting with the Governor's council to address the veto message.

We feel confident that during the process of trying to get the bill passed, the issue of freezing steps was brought to the forefront and the concept of freezing steps is inherently wrong. We have had many discussions with the incoming County Executive as well as the NIFA Chairman and board members. We feel confident that we won the day with the argument that the steps should be sacred and have had a lot of positive response to that end.

Fortunately for all of us, NIFA and the county have stated that the fiscal year 2018 budget is balanced, therefore, there should be no concern of an imminent wage freeze. Furthermore, while we wage our legal fight in federal court with respect to the NIFA wage freeze lawsuit, it should be important to note that the judge in that case stated that the Buffalo Teachers vs. the Buffalo Control Board decision is the template to be used in the case. Both NIFA and the county have acknowledged that decision from the judge.

In the Buffalo decision, the federal courts have held that a wage freeze should be used only as a last resort and it should not be used for political expediency nor should it be used as a tool for collective-bargaining. We fully intend to hold the county and NIFA to that decision.

It was a major achievement to get this bill passed in both houses of the legislature and we are not about to walk away from this fight. Additionally, it should be reiterated it was passed unanimously. The steps were bought and paid for already and you are fully entitled to each and every one of them.

In the upcoming months, after we re-introduce the bill, we will deal with any and all issues to get this important matter brought to a successful conclusion.

I know many of you are as frustrated as I am. Do not let this distract you when you are out there doing the job of policing. Stay safe and let your PBA continue this fight for you. The entire Executive Board, our Trustees and Delegates are fully committed to this issue.

On a lighter note, Happy New Year! Hope that everyone enjoyed their holiday season! We have had many changes occur in the County in the past year as we go forward. A new County Executive, Police Commissioner and staff, new leadership in all three police unions, we have had many seasoned officers separate from service to retirement and greener pastures. Yet still, time and the job moves along. I anticipate this as a pivotal year for both the County and the police department. Big decisions are pending and hopefully the powers that be are poised to make the right choices!

Legal Report

There are several recurrent themes that we see over and over again when we do appointments with members. Thankfully, most of these issues are easily dealt with. The troubling part is that several are so important that they continuously warrant discussion and need to be stressed because the failure to understand these important issues can be the difference between a claim that goes very smoothly and a claim that is constantly bombarded with obstacles.

For starters, with so many new and young members on the force, we must discuss what you need to do when you get injured on the job. Every claim begins with an event that causes an injury to a member. In many cases, these initial moments are the most important on the case, and they can be the difference between a claim that is properly documented and protected, and one that has a fatal flaw that cannot be repaired. When a member gets injured on the job, the proper documentation and reporting of the injury is crucial. Under the Department Manual, a member who is injured in the line of duty has seven (7) days to report the injury to the Department. This step is crucial. Countless times members have told us that they were told they needed to submit an accident report (aided packet) immediately or as soon as possible, otherwise it will not be accepted. This is not correct. The seven (7) day reporting rule exists to protect both the member and the Department. The Department will not be prejudiced by a member waiting one week to report an injury because in most cases, the Department already has verbal reporting of the injury to a supervisor, and in instances where the member is so badly injured that he cannot work he will have already reported the injuryto the Police Surgeon, if physically possible. This rule should be utilized by the member to protect the himself and make sure that he or she has ample time to produce a fully complete and fact specific report documenting the injury. Proper documentation of an injury matters when it comes to the New York State Police and Fire Retirement System, and a lazy or inaccurate

description of an event can be the difference between a 3/4 or accidental disability pension and one that results in only 50% or a performance of duty disability pension.

We have seen too many injuries go unreported or not properly documented over the years. If you have read this Legal Report in the past, you have also seen that we are not necessarily fans of "non-recordables". Though we certainly understand their value from a certain point of view, we have also seen many times over the years where members start a claim with a non-recordable but the injury turns out to be much worse than they initially thought. When they filed the "non-recordable", they failed to take the time to properly document all of the specific set of circumstances that caused the injury, particularly giving short shrift to the description of how the injury occurred and then, when the Retirement System evaluates the initial injury report, the Retirement System sees no distinction between a "non-recordable" and a full injury packet. The "non-recordable" is a short cut, a time saver, which typically does not command the attention to detail as does a full aided packet. Therefore, that initial report, the nonrecordable, will be the first description of the injury and the one that the Retirement System typically will use when making its determination as to whether or not the injury was the result of an "accident," as this term is defined in the Retirement and Social Security Law.

These initial reports can either make or break a claim that may not be filed until years later. Attention to detail is a must. Thus, we also advise our clients to tell their delegates and trustees about their injuries as soon as possible. Not only are the PBA delegates incredibly knowledgeable about how to handle this process, but they also will contact our office if there are any issues that need clarification. So, if there is any discrepancy or question as to how to draft a report or describe the accident, we can assist in making sure the report is thorough and accurate, even if the injury first appears to be relatively minor and not expected to have any negative impact on the officer's career.

The reporting process is not only important to the Department itself, but it is also required for both the Workers' Compensation claim as well as for the Retirement System. Under the Workers' Compensation Law, an injured worker has two years to file a claim with the Board itself but must report the accident to his or her employer within 30 days of the occurrence. If the injury is not reported, the employer can essentially controvert the claim on the basis that it was not timely reported, thus costing the injured worker the medical coverage that he or she is entitled to for the injury as well as the monetary benefits that he or she might be entitled to while out of work. In the case of an extremity body part such as a knee or shoulder injury, that can also mean missing out on a schedule loss of use settlement that might be worth thousands of dollars. In addition, under the Retirement and Social Security Law, a member must report the injury to the Comptroller's office as well in order to be protected under the disability statutes. For those who have had injuries in the past, you are likely thinking that you have never filed an accident report with

the Comptroller before. You would be absolutely correct. The reason is that a properly and timely filed accident claim with the Workers' Compensation Board satisfies the filing requirements of the Comptroller and a timely filed accident report with the Police Department satisfies the 30 day notice requirement of the Workers' Compensation Law. It is a domino effect: file your full aided packet (or "unrecordable" if you absolutely must) with the Department within the required seven (7) days and you have protected the filing requirements for Workers' Compensation and disability retirement pensions.

Please keep these documentation requirements in mind the next time you suffer or hear about another member suffering an injury on the job. Our goal is to make sure these concerns and problems are eradicated so each member is fully protected both with the Department and any other claims that might arise because of the line of duty injury.

We wish you, your families and friends a very safe, happy and prosperous New Year. HQ 1 Delegate Report

by James Quigley

I would like to this time to inform our membership about a program that is offered by the New York State Police and Fire Retirement System that most of our members are eligible to take advantage of, but very few know about. The NYS PFRS has a program in which members are able to VOLUNTARILY contribute a percentage of their gross pay into the pension system. These "excess contributions" earn a rate of 5% and can be removed at any time by the enrollee. If the member leaves these "excess contributions" in the system, when you retire, these monies (plus interest) will convert to an annuity, backed by the NYS PFRS pension system, and will add an additional amount to your regular pension.

SOME POINTS REGARDING THE PROGRAM

- 1. All Tier 1 and 2 members and PFRS Tier 3 (Article 11) members covered by a non-contributory retirement plan may voluntarily contribute from 1 to 10 percent of gross earnings to their member account.
- 2. You receive 5 percent interest on voluntary contributions and may become eligible to borrow against your contributions. (3% guaranteed, plus up to an additional 2% based on the Retirement System's earnings. The interest rate on these contributions has been 5 percent since 1976.)
- 3. You can start or stop voluntary contributions by filing the appropriate form with your payroll office.
- 4. If you stop voluntary contributions, you must wait 12 months to resume making them.
- 5. Members may withdraw voluntary contributions (also known as excess contributions), plus interest, at any time before retirement, regardless of whether they are working. Withdrawing voluntary contributions does not terminate Retirement System membership for these members.
- 6. As per NYS PFRS Rep Charlie Anderson, all contributions are POST TAX

HOW TO ENROLL

- 1. Simply fill out NYS Section 21(L) Election Form RS 5379. Which can be found at the following website: https://www.osc.state.ny.us/retire/forms/rs5379.pdf
- 1. Fill out the above form with the pertinent information and forward it to Kathy Tenenbaum in Personnel and Accounting.

I personally have opted into this program, and it initially took the better part of almost 15 months to finally get it up and running, due to the fact that I was the first person to try to enter into this program in at least 15 years. As of now, I have heard it takes about 2 or 3 pay cycles to start the deductions. One reminder that I would like to point out to any possible enrollees, is that when they say "gross" pay, they mean it. Every check has the enrollees selected percentage deducted (big check, mini checks, holiday checks....)

If the rumors are to be believed there may be a rash of retirements in the first month or so of the New Year. All the best to those that have put in their time and are finally calling it quits. May God bless you and watch over you in your next act. Speaking of retirement please be advised that a lot of people are leaving this job and the order says that they have resigned. That is just a paperwork job because if you have prior time that is only on the civilian side of the pension system that is what you must do. You then subsequently file for retirement from New York State and ask for your Police time to be transferred over. This is what I will be doing in a couple of months' time. If you have 20 years on this job, but, you have time somewhere else in the system call the union or the pension system in Albany to find out if you are eligible for any extra benefits. The pension system always does what is best for you but you will need to have the proper documentation and paperwork to accomplish this. If any of the above criteria fits you you owe it to yourself to gather all the information you can get and make an informed decision. This is a change that occurred in 2009. Again, if you were a County C.O., Court Officer, or have time in a local government you may be eligible. Please call the union office for further clarification.

Finally I would like to wish a speedy recovery to our own retired John Trutt. John recently had fusion surgery on his cervical spine. Obviously Police work is dangerous in many ways and it hurt JT. Keep rehabbing John and we will see you up and about very soon.

Well that's all for this month and we'll see you in February.



Happy New Year everyone. I hope everyone had a nice holiday and our snowbirds are getting ready to fly south again. So am I. I'll be heading down to Nassau Blue later this month so I'll see a lot of you there.

Here's some important information regarding retired officers carrying out of state. Under HR218, you must qualify each year for the weapon you are carrying. It can only be a "police type firearm" i.e., 38, 40 cal, A 22 derringer does not qualify unless you were authorized to use, carry and qualified using that weapon when you were on the job. In NY and 7 other states, you may not carry more than 10 rounds in a magazine. When carrying under the HR218, make sure you have your photographic ID from your department and also your HR218 qualification card. Under the HR218, you can only carry the weapon "concealed". If you are not sure about any of the provisions, go online and check everything out. Remember that you are carrying as a private citizen and you should be aware of the state laws regarding use of deadly force. The laws vary from state to state and you should be aware of the laws in each state that you carry. You should also be aware that there are different requirements if you are carrying with a state conceal carry permit. For example, if you have a Florida CCP, it is recognized in 37 other states and some of the restrictions are not as prohibited as parts of HR218.

ARPO dues notices were sent out in November. We would appreciate it if you paid your dues in a timely manner. If you fail to pay your ARPO dues by January 31st, you will have to pay a late fee in addition to your dues after that date.

Again, I would like to remind you that we are looking for stories and photos from you for future issues of the ARPO newsletters. The ARPO newsletter is your newsletter and we would like to have as much input in it from you as possible.

Are you living in a great place outside of NYS? We would like to hear about it and inform our other members of the great fine you have. Many of our retirees are looking to move out of NY (can you blame them?) and any information or tips you can give them will be greatly appreciated.

For those who have not done so in a while you should check your contact and personal information with the PBA and the Department especially if you have any changes in your life. Your PBA has instituted a Pension Estimate benefit for all FULL Dues paying Members. This benefit will entitle each member to one Pension Estimate during the course of his or her career. As a part of this service you will be entitled to have your pension estimate updated for 3 years after the initial estimate. We have hired Lynn Ang Pension Estimate and Projections L.L.C. to perform these estimates for the members. To take advantage of this benefit you will have to obtain a Pension Estimate Voucher at the PBA office. This voucher will then be given to Lynn when you meet with him to perform the initial estimate.

Police Unity Tour

In May 1997 the Police Unity Tour was organized by Officer Patrick P. Montuore of the Florham Park Police Dept., with the hope of bringing public awareness of Police Officers who have died in the line of duty and to honor their sacrifices. The Police Unity Tour started with 18 riders on a four day fund-raising bicycle ride from Florham Park, NJ to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington D.C. which raised \$18,000.00. Today, the Police Unity Tour has over 1900 members nationwide who make the trip. In late 2005, the Police Unity Tour pledged \$5 million in support of the National Law Enforcement Museum. Inspired by our commitment and our motto, "We Ride For Those Who Died", the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund has selected our organization to be the sponsor of the Museum's Hall of Remembrance. As of May 2016, the Police Unity Tour has donated over \$20 Million Dollars, which included this years highest donation ever of 2.5 million dollars.

Chapter 37 New York

We are the NEW YORK chapter of the Police Unity Tour. Chapter 37 was started by Port Authority police officers in 2002 and named in honor of the 37 PAPD officers who were killed in the line of duty on September 11, 2001 at the World Trade Center. Although designated the New York chapter, our membership of active and retired law enforcement officers also includes police departments from California, New Jersey and New Hampshire. We also view ourselves as the 9/11/01 Memorial Chapter. The original Chapter 37 members are represented by members of the Port Authority NY/NJ, Huntington Beach CA, Glendale CA, Nassau County and the New York City Police Departments.
