G.O.A.T. OUTGOING FIRST VICE PRESIDENT PETER PATERSON

In 2006 when I started my tenure as a PBA delegate in the Sixth Precinct I met the Corresponding Secretary Pete Paterson. I was very impressed by his professionalism and someone who always got the job done. Pete had an extensive history in his PBA career starting as a Third Precinct PBA Delegate from 1992-2005, Corresponding Secretary 2005-2008, and First Vice President 2008-2021. I had asked Pete to give me some notes on some of his achievements during his tenure as a PBA representative for this months article. What I received from Pete was a 13 page email of all the committees, achievements, and legislative bills he enacted into law. accomplishments and his resume are second to none. All of them are important to not only our membership but membership throughout the state, and other Police Departments. Here are some of the bills he helped champion to laws. Accidental 9/11 disability, death benefits, Zadroga, extending time frame to file 9/11, that continues to impact law enforcement statewide. Binding arbitration. Improvements to pension tiers and service credit. Chief negotiator of the legislation to protect our members through steps legislation. He negotiated the first Covid-19 presumption which later led to Covid-19 death benefits. Pete knew that we needed to treat Covid-19 like 9/11 as it could impact Police Officer's many years later. He negotiated memorandums covering Police Officer's that transferred from NYPD in the event

anyone suffered from 9/11 illness. He enacted laws to honor members killed in the line of duty including Detective Kathleen Holland, Police Officer's Michael Califano, Joseph Oliveri, Arthur Lopez, and achieved a memorial erected in Massapequa Park for Police Officer Geoffrey Breitkopf.

There are current bills he initiated that I want to accomplish to get enacted into law. Tier V & VI legislation to move members to better tiers. Tier V & VI overtime earnings legislation. Improve Tier V & VI military benefits for members who honorably serve our country. Heart Bill Clarification that will mirror New York City Police Pension System's presumption 75% instead of 50%. There are other current bills not listed that I will note at a later time.

Pete Paterson has always been the consummate professional. He has earned the respect from politicians from all political parties. He is truly the elder statesman. I cannot express enough gratitude being mentored by Pete. I am looking forward to working with the Legislative Committee in Albany. They are dedicated to chaptering bills that are good for our cops, as well as, killing bills that hurt our membership. Legal Report

When it comes to Workers' Compensation cases, one of the major things that pops up for members that have been through the process once or twice is the topic of settlements. Even for those members that haven't yet been injured, they will likely hear stories throughout their commands of other officers that were hurt in the line of duty, and then after a period of time, are able to settle their claim with the County, receiving a large check in the process. Quite often, it is one of the first questions that we are asked when we are describing the process and why it is important to file for Workers' Compensation in addition to the underlying protections of 207-c and your line of duty injury process with the Department. So, what is a Workers' Compensation settlement and how does it come about?

The easiest answer is that to some extent a Workers' Compensation settlement is a bit of a legal fiction, most of the time. In Workers' Compensation, you are not settling your claim in the same manner or for the same reasons that someone might be settling a case in other legal claims. For instance, with a personal injury

lawsuit, there may be minimal damages or lost time from a job, so you very well may be settling the case for purely the pain and suffering and anguish caused by the injuries. Unfortunately, pain and suffering are not compensable in the Workers' Compensation arena, so you cannot settle your case for those reasons with the County. Therefore, there must be something else that goes on when people discuss their "settlement" in Workers' Compensation. Typically, that means they received what is known as a "Schedule Loss of Use" award for their injuries.

Under the Workers' Compensation Law, many body parts are given a value. That value has existed for decades and was quantified merely by statute as opposed to anything else. Further, that value is in number of weeks of benefits to which someone is entitled to for an injury to that body part. For instance, the Workers' Compensation Law states that an arm is worth 312 weeks of compensable benefits. Thus, if someone loses his or her arm in an industrial accident, the law says that person is entitled to six years of Workers' Compensation awards for that injury. To get to the value of the award or the settlement, that number of weeks is multiplied by the total rate of compensation for that injured worker. The total rate of compensation is valued by the law as two-thirds your average weekly wage (the average gross wages paid in the 52 weeks preceding the injury date) up to the statutory maximum for the date of injury. Currently for any injuries suffered after July 1, 2021, the maximum rate of compensation is \$1,063.05. Also keep in mind, any awards from Workers' Compensation are entirely tax-free.

For a police officer who suffers an injury on the job and does not lose the entire function of that body part, how does that translate to an award and how do we handle that as a law firm? For starters, our goal initially on a case is not always to attempt to maximize a case for settlement purposes. While that might be an excellent outcome to a claim, we have always focused on what is best for the officer in the long term for his or her career, and our initial focus is always on the wellbeing of the officer's medical condition. However, once the condition stabilizes, we would start to evaluate any permanent injury for awards once the medical condition appears to be coming towards a point that is called Maximum Medical Improvement (MMI). It is at the point of MMI where the treating doctor can evaluate the percentage of permanent loss of use to the body part suffered due to the injury. In the case of a shoulder injury, that injury will affect the function of the arm as a whole and thus, the percentage is a loss of use of the entire arm. In the case of an ankle injury, the law attributes any loss of function to a loss of use of the foot as opposed to the whole leg. Therefore, the percentage of loss of use from that body part is then set with the value set by the law for the injury date.

For example, if a member ends up with a 20% schedule loss of use to the right arm, that would equate to 20% of 312 weeks of total benefits available or 62.4 weeks. That 62.4 weeks of benefits would then be multiplied by the total rate of compensation, and in the case of a member at top pay, that maximum rate would be \$1,063.05. Therefore, the total value of that 20% loss of use would be \$66,334.32. However, that would not necessarily be the settlement amount.

In the case of schedule loss of use awards, the law also indicates that the employer is entitled to be reimbursed for any wages that have been paid out while the injured worker was out with the injury. Therefore, the insurance carrier will take credit for any wages or any prior workers' compensation monies that were paid out following the injury. In the case of a Nassau County Police Officer, that can be a very large amount of money because they will be paid full salary while out of work entirely line of duty under 207-c. Money that is paid while a member is working restricted assignment does not count because the member is actually working, albeit not full duty.

In the case above, if the member with the right shoulder injury misses 6 weeks of work, that entire period of time would be deducted from his or her award. If that member is paid \$15,000 worth of salary while out, the County takes credit for that money in the settlement, and thus, the member is left with a settlement of \$51,334.32. As you can see, the time spent out of work entirely is basically an advance on any kind of settlement.

The percentage of loss of use is based on a number of factors, but for the most part, it comes down to evaluations by the treating doctor and then an evaluation on behalf of the County by an "independent medical examiner" paid for by the County. These doctors are supposed to be using guidelines promulgated by the Workers' Compensation Board in order to standardize the process. While there is some subjectivity to the process and the different doctors involved, we have a lot of experience with these cases and settlements so we have a very good idea of where cases will end up.

Recently, we have had some very high settlements over \$100K which is a major reason as to why we are so diligent in telling officers to make sure they file their Workers' Compensation claims even when they think they have relatively minor injuries. Also, if you choose to handle your claim on your own, what do you think are the odds that after a year the County is going to call you to remind you that you are entitled to a settlement? Almost next to nil... You need to be aware to what you are entitled in order to best protect yourself for the future.

Of course, every case is different and every settlement will look different. Our office has been proud to represent and handle these claims for the Nassau PBA since 1988, so we analyze each case with the advantage of decades of experience dealing with the County. Our goal is always the best interest of the officer for the long term and not necessarily grabbing a quick settlement because it's out there. 



Dear PBA Member,

Periodically, your PBA reminds its membership of appropriate steps that should be taken if you are called to Internal Affairs or become part of ANY department investigation. Recent events underscore the importance of involving the PBA and your legal counsel, me, as soon as possible.

Should you be called to Internal Affairs, be it as a witness or subject, you must notify your local PBA representative IMMEDIATELY. If you are deemed a subject, you have the right to have both a union representative and legal counsel with you during the interview. If the investigation is criminal in nature, call me first!

REMEMBER: You must be afforded a reasonable amount of time to contact a PBA representative and attorney. You have the right to confer with us both before and after questioning.

YOUR PBA REPRESENTATIVES AND ATTORNEY ARE HERE TO PROTECT YOU!

In any situation, be it at Internal Affairs or otherwise, where you are asked to write a letter and there is even a remote possibility of discipline, be sure to begin the letter with the following statement:

"I am making this statement for administrative purposes only. I have not done so voluntarily, but in compliance with an order of a Superior Officer. This statement in no way constitutes any waiver of my rights, and this statement, or any part thereof, may not be used against me in any subsequent criminal proceeding."

Finally, upon notifying your PBA representative that you have been called to Internal Affairs as the subject of an investigation, we will arrange to meet prior to your interview at my office to review the facts and circumstances.
