President's Message

It is never acceptable to lose one of our own but because my time in office started with the death of Chuck Vroom, the clarity of my purpose is reaffirmed. The PBA, and those who lead it, exist to serve the members. Like the public we serve, who only need the police on their worst days, our members often only personally need the PBA when something goes wrong. I am honored that our PBA was so integral in laying Chuck to rest with the ceremony he deserved and ensuring for the future care of his son, Sean.

Officer Charles Vroom died twenty years and one day after the 9/11 terror attacks. As a young NYPD officer, he was a part of the response and recovery at Ground Zero. In the coming years we will add Chuck's name to memorials at Police Headquarters, Albany, and Washington D.C. This month, we travel to Washington to remember our members who are now among the fallen of 9/11: Brian Abbondandelo, Peter Curran, Peter Martino, Paul McCabe, James Quinn, and Michael Shea. In D.C., we stand watch, lay wreaths, and hold vigils. There is a statue of a lion at each of the four entrances of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial that represent the protective role of law enforcement. In Nassau County, where we wear a lion on our patch, the Memorial's lions represent something additional—even when we return home, the lions remain to watch over the wall that displays the names of our departed.

Officer Vroom, and all six of our brethren whom we honor this year, embody valor. Their fortitude through harrowing experiences speak louder than any story told. They were put through the wringer to meet the standard of their chosen profession. Our heroes embody true bravery, the type worthy of emulating and idolizing. Their courage extended well past the events of 9/11. The real strength of their spirit came in the years after September 11, 2001, when while still doing the dayto-day job of policing, they watched so many of their colleagues grow sick and many die. We have now lost more survivors of the attack to cancer and disease in the two decades that followed 9/11 than we lost on the infamous day itself. For Chuck, the Covid-19 pandemic was yet another catastrophe through which he worked and ultimately, it is the one that took him from us.

As I said before, the everyday work of the PBA pales in scope to loss and remembrance but it continues regardless. I am spending the gift of this time as President making good on promises made and positioning our collective future for success.

PROMISES KEPT

In my first week, eliminating an outside consultant and accepting a resignation from a public relations firm, as well as renegotiating terms with our advertising agency, saved the membership \$132,000/year—an amount more than the annual dues of over 100 full members. In addition, the restoration of the Coalition (CSEA, COBA, DAI, and SOA) that began with fixing relationships and opening communication, produced two results by the end of my second week.

First, the PBA obtained the agreement of all the necessary parties (the Coalition leaders, the County, and the arbitrator), to merge the longevity arbitration. This means that starting on October 18th (then again on November 22nd) the PBA joins the Coalition in front of a single arbitrator to make the case for our stolen longevity. Previously, we successfully defended ourselves against two legal attacks against longevity by the County. Now, in arbitration, it is finally our collective turn to make our case and to win our longevity back.

Second, the Coalition leaders are united in actively supporting Anne Donnelly in her candidacy for Nassau County District Attorney. Both the Board of Governors and the Political Action Committee voted in favor of endorsing Donnelly, a 32-year veteran of the DA's Office.

MOVING FORWARD TOGETHER

Five of eight current members of the Executive Board announced their retirements, only John Paterson and Sean Mulligan seek reelection. Every current delegate and trustee remain a member of the PBA Committees that they were on before my election. They are your chosen, elected representatives, and there is no shortage of work to do. My term in office in unhindered by mistakes made before me. Together, we have everything to give and so much yet to achieve. I am grateful for the opportunity to continue building on our early success.

Legal Report

Another summer has come and gone, and we are settling into the beginning of another change of the seasons. It also means that we are settling back into the regular schedule of life with kids going back to school and vacations being over. However, with change also can come the opportunity to strengthen our understanding of how to protect ourselves, the benefits that the union has fought generations to achieve and protect, and to ensure the protection of the ones that we love. As we have written about for years, in many ways, the best way to protect these benefits that the union has fought so hard to get is to keep your PBA delegates and trustees advised of any and all issues that might happen while you are working or that might affect your ability to keep working. They are absolutely your lifelines to getting the best information and answers to keeping yourself safe and protected.

With that being said there are, of course, issues that have popped up over the past few months that always prompt reminders that need to be sent out to the members. For starters, you have read in The Legal Report that documenting your injuries is the best way to protect yourself, and that documentation should be accurate and thorough (while also being as brief as possible). As you can imagine, there is a bit of an artform to both being brief and concise while at the same time making sure that the description of your accident is full of the details that will protect you into the future. The best examples of issues that we have come across come from actual events over the years. For instance, if you simply write "injured back while effecting an arrest" then that claim will certainly protect the member for the line of duty portion of the case within the Police Department, and will also protect the member in a Workers' Compensation claim, but it will not be protective for the purposes of being an "accident" in order to qualify for a 3/4 disability pension. However, if the real story is that "while effecting an arrest, the subject violently resisted arrest and tackled the undersigned into a door frame injuring my back" then not only have you protected the case for line of duty purposes and for Workers' Compensation benefits, but also for 3/4 disabdility purposes as this description is likely to be considered an "accident" for the purposes of a disability pension. In the heat of writing your accident description statement, an entire future for a potential 3/4 disability case will be set in motion - so take your time, and make sure you protect yourself. Also, remember, tell your PBA representatives that you have been injured in the line of duty so they can assist!

The other major reminder about accident statements is how long you have to report your injuries to the Department as guided by the Police Department

Manual. The Manual states that you must report any injuries to the Department within seven (7) days of the occurrence. What that means for members is that there should be no rush to complete a PDCN 206a as soon as possible when you have a full seven days to reflect on what happened, and to make sure that the statement is written accurately. We have found that stepping back, allowing the adrenaline of the situation to dissipate, and then getting the proper parties involved will lead to a much better result for the member. This is opposed to rushing and giving a statement that cannot be easily amended in the future simply because a supervisor told you that they want to get the packet done right away. Remember, you are not being difficult just for the sake of being difficult – you are protecting yourself in case you need to file for a disability pension in the future! If the Manual gives you the time to turn in your statement, take full advantage of it and make sure that you are protected by submitting a consise and accurate statement.

In this situation, the other thing to keep in mind is that the vast majority of events causing injuries to police officers will not be "accidents" as defined under the law for disability retirement purposes. They are simply incidents that occur as a result of normal police duties which can still be covered as disability but only for a 50% Performance of Duty Disability pension.

And while we never want to think about the most tragic of circumstances that a police officer might encounter, there are things that every officer should make sure are in order just in case a tragedy occurs. These are always the most difficult situations that our office encounters, and although the PBA membership as a whole always steps up to the plate to protect each other and be there for each other, inevitably issues pop up in the aftermath that can be avoided if properly handled previously. As you have heard in your precincts, the Retirement System online portal is an excellent tool to keep your information up to date with the Retirement System as changes happen throughout your lives. Adding beneficiaries, or changing beneficiaries, is something that we often do not think about as we go about our day to day lives, but we have seen situations where the same beneficiary that someone listed when they were a rookie on the job has never been changed some twenty plus years later. We have seen situations where ex-spouses were mistakenly left as beneficiaries to benefits that the member never intended to leave to that person, and unfortunately, there is nothing that can be done about that after the fact. Also, it is always amazing to us how many members do not have wills when they pass away, and this is despite the union having attorneys that are willing to do simple wills for members without charge or more complicated trust setups for reduced rates. Take advantage of these benefits because if someone passes without a will, it creates a time delay for the family you leave behind as they are forced to have your estate go through probate

and the courts before many of the benefits can even be accessed.

Obviously, there are hours of reminders that we can go through on a regular basis (and do go through) with members constantly. These are a few of the ones that might be at the forefront of the discussions in the precincts as changes are taking place through all aspects of our lives. Please know that we are always here to help you in whatever way that we can. We are a resource much like your PBA leadership. Take advantage of the years of knowledge and wisdom that we all have in order to best protect yourself and your families. The defendant was charged with Criminal Mischief, Reckless Endangerment, and Criminal Possession of a Firearm. Great work!!!!

On August 16th Officers responded to the Rite Aid in North Bellmore for a possible disturbance. Officers Sovaras and Nordland arrived and were notified by the store manager that a suspect had just stole items from the store and when the victim approached the suspect he threw the items at her, and stated he would kill her. 
Fourth Precinct



NEVER FORGET



Every September, that same somber feeling seems to take over as the month begins. This year marks the 20th anniversary of the terrorist attacks that changed the world forever. It's hard to fathom because it seems like just yesterday.

On September 11, 2001, just like so many others, the Marine Bureau answered the call. Shortly after the first plane struck the North Tower, boat crews responded to Marine Base and began gearing up with medical supplies and got underway towards the World Trade Center to assist in the rescue efforts.

Marine 6 was the first NCPD vessel on scene with a crew of PO's Haggerty, Owens, Radalinsky and Tirman with Sgt. Cordara aboard as supervisor. Shortly after, Marine 5 arrived with PO's Amberman, Cegelski, Nappi and Sanford with Sgt. Cunningham as supervisor. They set up at West Cove Marina at Ground Zero and were advised by Incident Commander, FDNY Deputy Chief Jim Harten, that there were many injured firefighters that were in need of immediate care and evacuation. The crews proceeded to provide medical assistance and started conducting emergency transports to the triage area at Liberty Park in Jersey City, NJ.

Marine 9, piloted by PO Joel Fuoco with a crew of PO's Costigan, Protitch and Tangney arrived shortly thereafter. All crews began pulling injured firefighters from the rubble, then secured them on trundles to be carried back to the boats where they could receive medical care and get evacuated.

Meanwhile, back in Nassau County, Lt. Ed Mitchell made arrangements for Towns and Municipalities to provide backup and cover our district waterways. All remaining Marine Bureau patrol vessels were then deployed to lower Manhattan with both manpower and supplies. Among those who responded were Sgt. Marschauser, PO's Amato, Begis, Krilovitch, McCloy, Sanguedolce, Scharp, Stathis, Vafaedes and others.

All of the Marine Bureau members went above and beyond the call of duty on that fateful day. They worked tirelessly under the worst possible conditions with inadequate PPE yet they forged ahead well into the afternoon hours the following day. The crews kept working despite the possibility of an additional attack as well as the threat of WTC 7 collapsing at any given moment, never once worrying about their own safety and wellbeing.

As a result of the terrorist attacks, Marine Bureau members PO's Brian Abbondandelo and Peter Curran lost their lives from cancers related to their active participation in the rescue efforts at Ground Zero. Countless other Marine Bureau members suffer from a variety of ailments directly attributed to their selfless service at the World Trade Center.

Having worked together with other police and fire department agencies, fishing boats, private yachts, ferries, cruising vessels, marine transportation tugboats and countless other maritime professionals from far and wide, the Marine Bureau took part in what became the largest sea evacuation in world history. Over the course of 9 hours, more than 500,000 people were evacuated from lower Manhattan.

Members of the Marine Bureau that responded immediately to the WTC on the morning of September 11, 2001 and the following days were recipients of the US 9/11 Medal and Citation.

As we reflect on the horrific events that took place that day, it is important to remember that thank those who headed directly into the unknown and faced unforeseen dangers without a second thought. Never for a minute thinking about their own best interests, our men answered the call admirably. September 11, 2001 was truly the NCPD Marine Bureau's finest hour. Thank you gentlemen. We appreciate you for everything you did.

FIREWORKS DISPLAY

On Sunday, August 15, 2021 at approximately 1700 hours, PO's Brendan McGovern, Joseph Votinelli and Christopher Campbell were assigned to Marine 11. While on patrol in the vicinity of West Harbor, Oyster Bay, the crew heard aloud explosion and observed a mushroom cloud of smoke southeast of their location near the Sagamore Yacht Club fuel dock.

The crew immediately advised Communications Bureau

and requested 2nd Precinct units, an ambulance and Aviation Bureau to begin responding to Sagamore Yacht Club. Having witnessed the explosion first hand, the crew quickly began making way towards the location and arrived within seconds. Upon arrival, the crew observed a male aided being helped ashore by Yacht Club employees. A black jet ski was fully engulfed and was promptly extinguished by members of the Atlantic Steamer Fire Company.

It was evident that a considerable amount of fuel was present on the surface of the water, which was creating a hazardous condition. With assistance from the Town of Oyster Bay Constables, the crew set up a security zone to prevent any vessel traffic from transiting the adjacent waterway until the potential hazmat situation was cleared.

Investigation at scene determined that a jet ski had just finished fueling and when the operator attempted to start the engine, the internal gasoline vapors ignited causing combustion. During the explosion, the jet ski operator was launched from the PWC and suffered lacerations and minor burns. The 2nd Precinct units and ambulance proceeded to transport the aided to an area hospital for treatment of his injuries. Fortunately, the aided's injuries were not life threatening and he is expected to make a full recovery.





This assignment is a perfect example of keen situational awareness. The expeditious radio notifications and fast response by PO's McGovern, Votinelli and Campbell prevented a hazmat situation from getting worse all while allowing for an aided to get immediate medical attention.

Dear PBA Member,

Periodically, your PBA reminds its membership of appropriate steps that should be taken if you are called to Internal Affairs or become part of ANY department investigation. Recent events underscore the importance of involving the PBA and your legal counsel, me, as soon as possible.

Should you be called to Internal Affairs, be it as a witness or subject, you must notify your local PBA representative IMMEDIATELY. If you are deemed a subject, you have the right to have both a union representative and legal counsel with you during the interview. If the investigation is criminal in nature, call me first!

REMEMBER: You must be afforded a reasonable amount of time to contact a PBA representative and attorney. You have the right to confer with us both before and after questioning.

YOUR PBA REPRESENTATIVES AND ATTORNEY ARE HERE TO PROTECT YOU!

In any situation, be it at Internal Affairs or otherwise, where you are asked to write a letter and there is even a remote possibility of discipline, be sure to begin the letter with the following statement:

"I am making this statement for administrative purposes only. I have not done so voluntarily, but in compliance with an order of a Superior Officer. This statement in no way constitutes any waiver of my rights, and this statement, or any part thereof, may not be used against me in any subsequent criminal proceeding."

Finally, upon notifying your PBA representative that you have been called to Internal Affairs as the subject of an investigation, we will arrange to meet prior to your interview at my office to review the facts and circumstances.
